The Visit of Legislators.

The proposed trip of the legislators of this province to Kingston, on information bent, is not without a precedent. Many years ago, when the Royal Military College was not as well known as it is today, when it was desired that the members of parliament should see the institution and get a personal demonstration as to its value, a special train brought a party of two hundred from Ottawa. They came they saw, they learned, and they voted the necessary supplies for a very necessary purpose.

The School of Mines is a government office, projected by Queen's College it is true, but built and equipped by the province and doing a work in education which is considered of the highest importance. Recently a deputation visited Toronto and laid before the government the claims of the school to further aid. The proposition was taken under advisement, and that it may be better understood, and that members of the house as well as the government should receive the fullest light, the excursion of next week is being planned.

It is hoped that it will have the effect of opening the eyes of government and parliament to the merits of the School of Mines, and that it will receive its due with something like the generosity which is extended to Toronto University. This last institution is provincial, and wholly dependent on provincial funds, but it is not doing all the educational work in Ontario, as any one can perceive who gives the subject the attention which it demands.

The man fought desperately, realizing that his life was at stake, and endeavored to worry him.

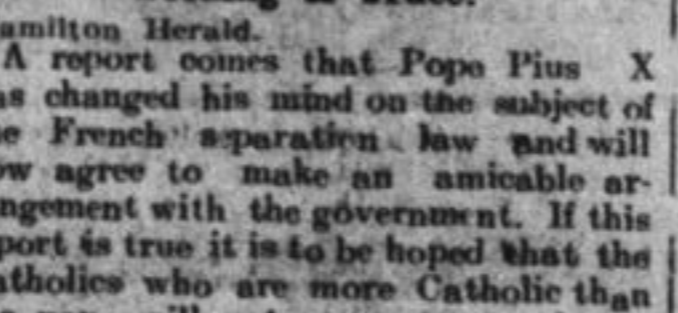
After a considerable time the burglar succeeded in tearing himself away from the dog and escaping from the room.

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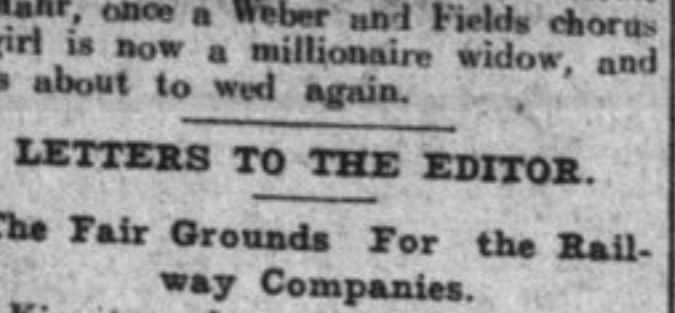
