Tips For The Farmers

The address given at Glenora, Wednesday by W. F. Stephen, of Huntington, Quebec, was a most instructive one, and it is to be regretted that a larger number could not have been present to hear it.

One important statement was made by Mr. Stephen, and that was that the dairy cow must be kept in the best condition possible, and that the output of her dairy cows may not be doubled within the next five years.

The railway yards are still being flooded with snow. The weather has been ideal this week for teaming, and the farmers certainly took advantage of the fine weather.

A well-known authority says: "Too many of us do not feed our cows with butter fat, but take the word of the creamery manager, and I believe that short weights and low tests are sometimes the cause of failure to get profits from the dairy. In fact I have known many cases where farmers have been systematically robbed by the managers of creameries, both in feeding liberally, and in the 'you-weigh-and-test-it' plan.

When the crop is taken out turn the fowls into this yard and plant the others in the same way. When the yards are divided into three or four, they may be prepared thoroughly and grass seeds of oats are mixed sown in it, with the vegetables in the second yard, while the fowls occupy the third.

Mangels are of considerable value, as also sugar beets if kept till early spring, when excellent food is secured.

When it is not possible to supply a range of considerable size for the fowls and they must be practically kept in yards, an excellent plan is to divide the yard into two or three sections, according to its size, and treat them in the following manner: Plow or Dygepeia.
