



FOR TREATING CONSUMPTION A Commission has been appointed by the Governor of Indiana to investigate tuberculosis conditions in the state and to make recommendation to the next general assembly of the Legislature that a state farm for the cure of consumption be

The Commission has prepared plans that include the expenditure of \$100,000 for the purchase of about 200 acres of good land and provide the necessary buildings, to care for about 300 people-150 male and 150 female.
