

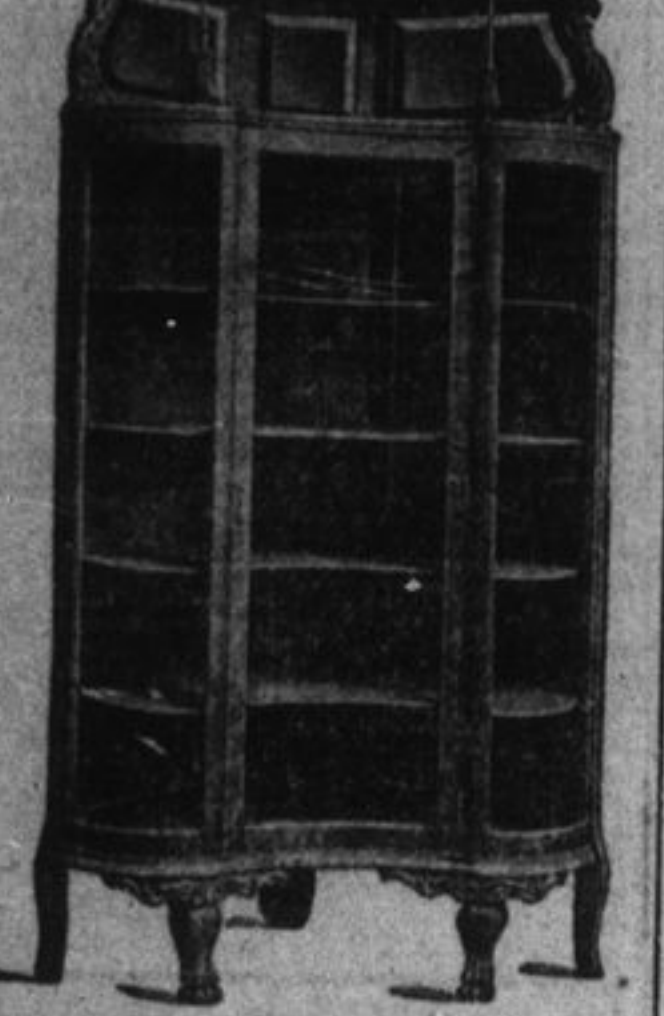

THE SPORT REVIEW

PETERBORO IS RAISING A BIG HOWL

Over the Midland-Kingston Sudden Death Game—Toronto Comments on the 14th Team—General Sporting News.

Peterboro is in trouble because the 14th of Kingston has won the senior O.H.A. district championship. THEIR ANNIVERSARY

SPECIAL SERVICE HELD BY THE Y. M. C. A.

Dr. Wilbur F. Crafts Speaks on "That Boy and Girl of Yours"—Report Given by Secretary Stokes.

There was a large attendance at the special service held in St. Andrew's church last night, to mark the thirty-third anniversary of the Kingston Y. M. C. A. A feature of the evening, was an address delivered by Dr. Wilbur F. Crafts, superintendent of the International Reform Bureau, Washington, D.C., on "That Boy and Girl of Yours." Dr. Crafts is a strong advocate for the family life, and devoted a large portion of his address to its broadening influence, also making an appeal for prohibition.

What F. H. Macnee Says

F. H. Macnee, manager of the 14th team, when asked about the likelihood of the local team being ordered to play a sudden-death game with Peterboro to settle the matter, said that his club would certainly not stand for anything of the kind. Peterboro, he declared, had no ground for complaint. When the schedule was drawn up the sudden-death game with Midland was agreed on, and the 14th has the correspondence with the O.H.A. secretary showing that this match was to count two wins and two losses, when the sudden-death game with the 14th could trim Peterboro on any neutral ice. Mr. Macnee admitted that they could—but he said that the 14th would not allow Peterboro to dictate at this stage, and overrule a schedule. The matter should have been arranged long ago, and not left to this late date.

The twenty-fifth anniversary of the Grand Council of Ontario, Royal Templars of Temperance, was celebrated by a banquet in Zion congregational church, Toronto. The event also marked the opening of the ninth annual conference of the grand council, composed of delegates who had arrived from points throughout the province. Hon. J. P. Whitney, replying to "Our Province," made a spirited address, urging the need of Canadians for a better sense of their responsibilities in the present situation, was reported in the friendly Toronto News:

"I have spent a great portion of my life endeavoring to think out the question that brings you here. And here to-night, I understand that you allow me to continue in public life, propose to devote a certain portion of my time to thinking out a remedy for the drink evil in this country. While knowing full well that I receive very little gratitude for doing so, I will be told, as I am told, that I have done what you people in alliance with the liquor trade, I will be told that by men who have spent a generation side by side with the liquor trade, I have done what was in my power. I admit, with defects, I am certain, but nevertheless with the honest desire and intention, and here to-night, the present reason, that I never received such an invitation before in this city. I insist that I am a co-worker with you people. The great object you have in view, "I am to be it from me to suggest to the government of which I am head is infallible, and does not make mistakes. I may say we have, as I know you will, because we are, talk. But you must allow me to say that as far as local option is concerned, you gained four or three or four elections in a short time."
