TO RUSH TUNNEL MUST BE READY BY JUNE 1ST 1909.

For Every Day it is Completed Before That Time the Contractors Get \$1,000; if After, They Pay \$1,000 a Day.

Windows, Ont., Feb. 21.—June 1st, 1909, is the date set for the completion of the tunnel beneath the Detroit river. Butler Bros., the contractors, are to receive \$1,000 per day for every day the tunnel is in operation before the time limit expires. On the other hand the tunnel company is to receive \$1,000 per day from Butler Bros. for every day that the tunnel is not completed after June 1st, 1909. It is expected that the first portion of the tube will be laid May 1st. Most of the work will be done with divers, as the contractors do not wish to take chances of blocking navigation in the Canadian channel during the summer months.

Gave A Concert.

The inmates at Rockwood hospital were treated to a fine concert on Tuesday evening. The Queen street quartette, composed of Messrs. Shea, Bradley, Rutherford and Manhard, was present and rendered several excellent numbers, and Miss Rita Mitchell, soloist, also contributed to the programme.

Brought To Kingston.

The remains of the late James K. Mains arrived in the city, on Wednesday night, and were conveyed to the family residence at No. 12 Russell street. Deceased's father, James Mains, of Waterloo, Quebec, will arrive in the city to-day. The funeral will take place Friday afternoon at Cataract cemetery.

Trouble For Him.

A man named Shano was brought to the county jail from Oso and charged with ill-using his wife. It appears that the two had a row while they were engaged in loading, and it is further alleged that Shano attempted to strike his wife with a pitch fork. The date for the case has not been set.

Traps Were Stolen.

Some person made a visit to the premises of John Hogan, a farmer living near Kingston Mills, and made off with eight of his muskrat traps. Mr. Hogan paid a search warrant, Wednesday, and had a search warrant taken out for the missing traps, and as a result a number of them were recovered. A police court case will, in all probability, follow.

Elect All Trustees.

It is understood that at a recent meeting of the advisory council to the minister of education, it was unanimously decided to recommend that boards of public, high and technical schools, and that all trustees be unqualified, and that all trustees be elected by the vote of the ratepayers, thus abolishing election by ward, and also doing away with appointments to city council, as now, of high school trustees.

The Board of Works.

Two important questions were to come before the board of works, this afternoon, one with reference to the building of limestone macadam roads and the other regarding the O'Kill street sewer extension. The city engineer will report as to how many limestone macadam blocks can be constructed for \$13,000. He will also show the board a plan regarding the sewer extension pipe. This scheme is to build a concrete pier out 150 feet and lay the pipe in it. The cost would be \$1,200 just as cheap as any other method.

Queen's Dramatic Club.

The Dramatic Club of Queen's University, some time ago, made it possible for the people of this city to witness the Shakespearean performances of the famous Ben Greet players. This year the same society has arranged to bring Miss Minnie M. Williams, of New York, before the Kingston public. As a professional actor, Miss Williams has had experience extending over a period of twelve years, and during that time has made two tours in England and Scotland, visiting such cities as London, Edinburgh, Birmingham, Liverpool, etc. She has this year for herself the reputation of a scholarly interpreter of Shakespeare's plays. NEWS OF THE WORLD OCCURRENCES RECOUNTED IN BRIEF FORM.

Matters That Interest Everybody

Notes From All Over-Little of Everything Easily Read and Remembered.

At hockey, Peterboro defeated Marlboro last night.

Toronto operators of the Great North-Western Telegraph company will ask for an increase of wages.

Hon. William Patterson gave a dinner at Ottawa to John Bain, retiring assistant commissioner of customs.

The Ontario branch of the Dominion Alliance opened in Toronto this morning with an attendance of over 400.

Robert McKnight, Toronto, eighty-two years of age, was instantly killed by the accidental discharge of a rifle.

The Collingwood winter poultry show is a great success, and fanciers claim the best of the kind held for many years.

Rena Johnston, six years of age, was fatally burned at her home, 100 Fern avenue, Toronto, and died at Grace hospital.

The grand council of the Royal Templars of Temperance endorsed the action of the Dominion council in raising the insurance rates.

Rajauli, the Moorish outlaw, is waiting patiently in a mountain village for want of pay to create a mutiny in the Sultan's army.

The French cruiser Jean Bartix is ashore off Galha Point, on the western coast of Morocco, and will be a total loss. Her crew got ashore safely.

The steamer Teutonic and other liners scheduled to sail from Liverpool, on February 20th, were unable to leave port on account of severe storms.

Senator Cloran will, probably, be appointed to the vacancy on the Ottawa Improvement Commission, in place of Sir William Hingston, deceased.

After an illness of a little over a week's duration, former attorney-general, John Cumteen, a leading member of the bar of the state, died at his home in Buffalo, N.Y., this morning.

At Belleville, Ont., the death occurred, Wednesday night, of Michael J. Lally, for many years license inspector of Hastings. Lally was sixty years of age and a well-known liberal politician.

The supreme court has given judgment condemning the Bank of Montreal to the loss of \$70,000 paid out on the Mafineau forged checks. The case will likely be carried to the privy council.

The receivers committee of the common trust, to-day, to inquire into the validity of the resignation of Hon. Mr. Hyman as member for London. All correspondence and witnesses are called for Thursday next.

A writ was issued, to-day, against the Toronto General Trust corporation by Mary Jane Scott, Toronto, who claims that the corporation as trustees of the late James Scott, be guilty of fraud, breach of trust, mistake in the handling of the trust.

Hon. A. B. Aylesworth states that the dominion government have no desire to prohibit the rights of Ontario in regard to control of companies, but when a corporation expresses its intention of extending operations beyond the province a federal charter is the only legal thing.

Pictou, N.S., Feb. 21.—Fire was discovered in Henderson's block, situated on Water street, at 3:30 a.m. Building together with stock, badly damaged.
