tubercular bacilli find their way into the human system through milk. This theory is at direct variance with the doctrine of Dr. Robert Koch, who says that tuberculosis milk is not dangerous, but that consumption in most cases is contracted through the inhaling of germs. The theory of Dr. Koch appears to be the one most generally accepted by the medical profession, and by all those who have made a careful study of the problem of tuberculosis.

The splendid results that have been accomplished through the organized effort to check the spread of tuberculosis, through treatment and precautions advocated under the Koch theory, seem to bear out the latter. The part of wisdom is to overlook no precaution that would tend to prevent infection with the dread white scourge.




