# TO PREVENT THE SPREAD OF

Medical supervision of the schools is badly needed, and steps should be taken to provide such, according to Dr. W. E. Fairfield, House Surgeon at St. Mary's Hospital, Green Bay, Wis. Tuberculobis, the disease which takes the lives of hundreds where others claim one, Dr. Fairfield believes should be grappled with and overcome in its very earliest stages when manifested among school children. Other contagious diseases, such as diphtheria and smallpox, are placarded and guarded against, but there is practically no attempt made to prevent tubercular infection. Children afflicted with this dread disease are allowed to mingle with healthy children as though there was not the slightest danger.

Teachers could do much to aid in eliminating consumptive children from the ranks of the healthy. The first manifestation of tuberculosis is an afternoon rise of temperature. leachers could be taught to take the temperature of the children and report suspicious cases. These could be sent to the health officer and reported to the parents. Children shown to be injected could then be kept apart. Fresh air with proper treatment would result in restoring health, while confinement in the school room would only give the disease an opportunity to build and grow.
