NEWS OF THE WORLD

OCCURRENCES RECOUNTED IN BRIEF FORM.

The Dowager Empress of Russia arrived in London, this morning. The government had no intention of selling the old military barracks at Halifax, Que.

The New York Central has not sold its holding in Reading railway to E. H. Harriman. The Grand Trunk Pacific is getting ready to invade the Yukon territory via Skagway.

The Allan steamer Pretorian for Liverpool, arrived at Fastnet, at 10.30 a.m., on the 6th. The Allan line steamer Panamanian for Havre and London sailed from Halifax, at 11 p.m. on 6th.

One hundred men who attacked on the work on the Michigan Central railway in Canada have returned to work. This morning the body of Dr. Oromyrtelka was taken from Massawippi, Ontario, and sent by a Grand Trunk special train to Deseronto.

Despatches from Yokohama describe the stranded steamship Dakota as being in a very bad position, and say it is uncertain whether she can be saved. The resignation of Cecil B. Smith, on the hydro-electric power commission, has been accepted, and that W. K. McNaught, M.P.P., has been appointed.

At the Canadian Mining Institute, Prof. Vanhise, of Wisconsin, said that from his observations he believed other districts would turn out to be just as rich as Colant.

The sailing steamer Leopard was crushed in the ice floes off Cape Race during a terrific gale, at midnight, and was totally wrecked. Her crew of 103 men reached land safely.

A report from Castellone, Italy, says the British ship Malaga was wrecked almost in sight of land off that port. Thirty bodies have been recovered and it is thought the whole ship's company was lost.
