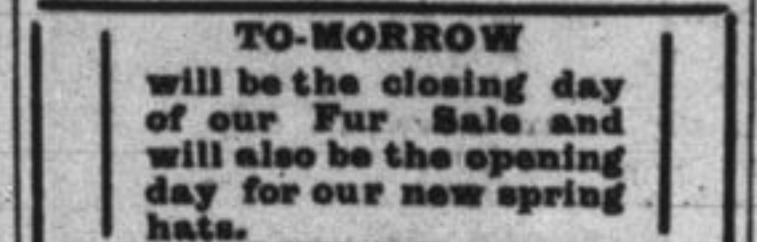
BOARD OF WORKS CONSIDERS THE BLOCKING OF SEVERAL STREETS.

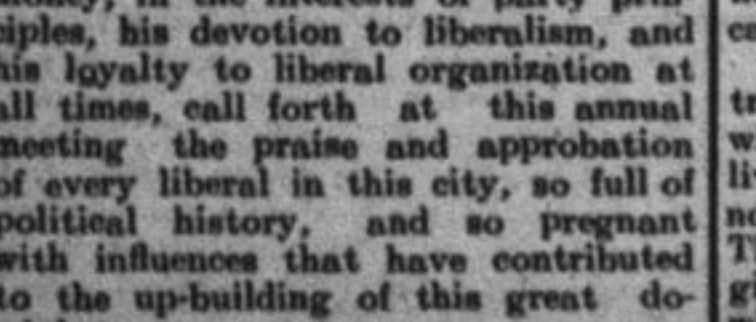
NURSES' VERY GRATEFUL.
