### DEMOCRATIC VICTORY.

F. W. Sackett Was Elected President.

Cape Vincent, March 20.—Cape Vincent charter election was held yesterday afternoon, and was not what could be called a spirited affair. The only fight was over the offices of treasurer and collector. There was an unusually large number of votes cast, considering the fact that there were no names printed on the official ballot and that the electors were obliged to write the names of the favorite on the right side of the sheet.

One hundred and forty-two electors took enough interest in village affairs to go to the polls and exercise their right of franchise with a lead pencil. For the office of president there were seven candidates, for treasurer ten, for collector eight, and for assessor six.

The ticket elected and the number of votes each candidate received was as follows: President, Frank W. Sackett, 89 votes; treasurer, Thomas J. Hagan, 61 votes; collector, H. Roy Allen, 66 votes. All the candidates on the successful ticket are democrats, with the exception of Mr. Sackett, who is a republican.

Mr. Sackett intends to decline. He filled the office for the year past and made a competent official, and those who re-elected him would feel sorely hurt should he not accept.

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
