New York, April 2.—Sowing her mother's life on a dead at the feet of a woman who had struck her down, Belato Torillo, a sixteen-year-old girl, No. 35 Jerome street, the Bronx, ran to her home with a revolver, shot her mother's assailant. A crowd of excited people looked on, apparently in sympathy with the girl.

WIFE'S THIRST FOR BEER.

No Base For Divorce Declared at St. Louis Judge. St. Louis, April 2.—Circuit Judge Mark G. Reynolds, in dismissing Judge Green's petition for divorce, held that a wife's fondness for beer was no ground for divorce. He added that the defendant's consumption of 400 bottles of beer a month as charged, was insufficient ground for a decree in favor of her husband.

NEGRO LYNCHED.

Hanged to a Derrick and Riddled With Bullets. Durant, I.T., April 2.—Jim Williams, a negro, charged with committing criminal assault on Lillie Mizner, white, Mrs. Collier, I.T., Saturday afternoon, was lynched at Durant, last night, by a mob of a thousand people. Williams was hanged to an oil derrick and his body riddled with bullets. Deputy U. S. marshals and local officers pleaded with the mob, and threatened it with their revolvers, but to no avail.

KILLED BY POWDER EXPLOSION.

Cincinnati, Ohio, April 2.—A dispatch from Laporte, Ind., reports that five men have been killed by a powder explosion at Aetna. The surrounding country was badly shaken.
