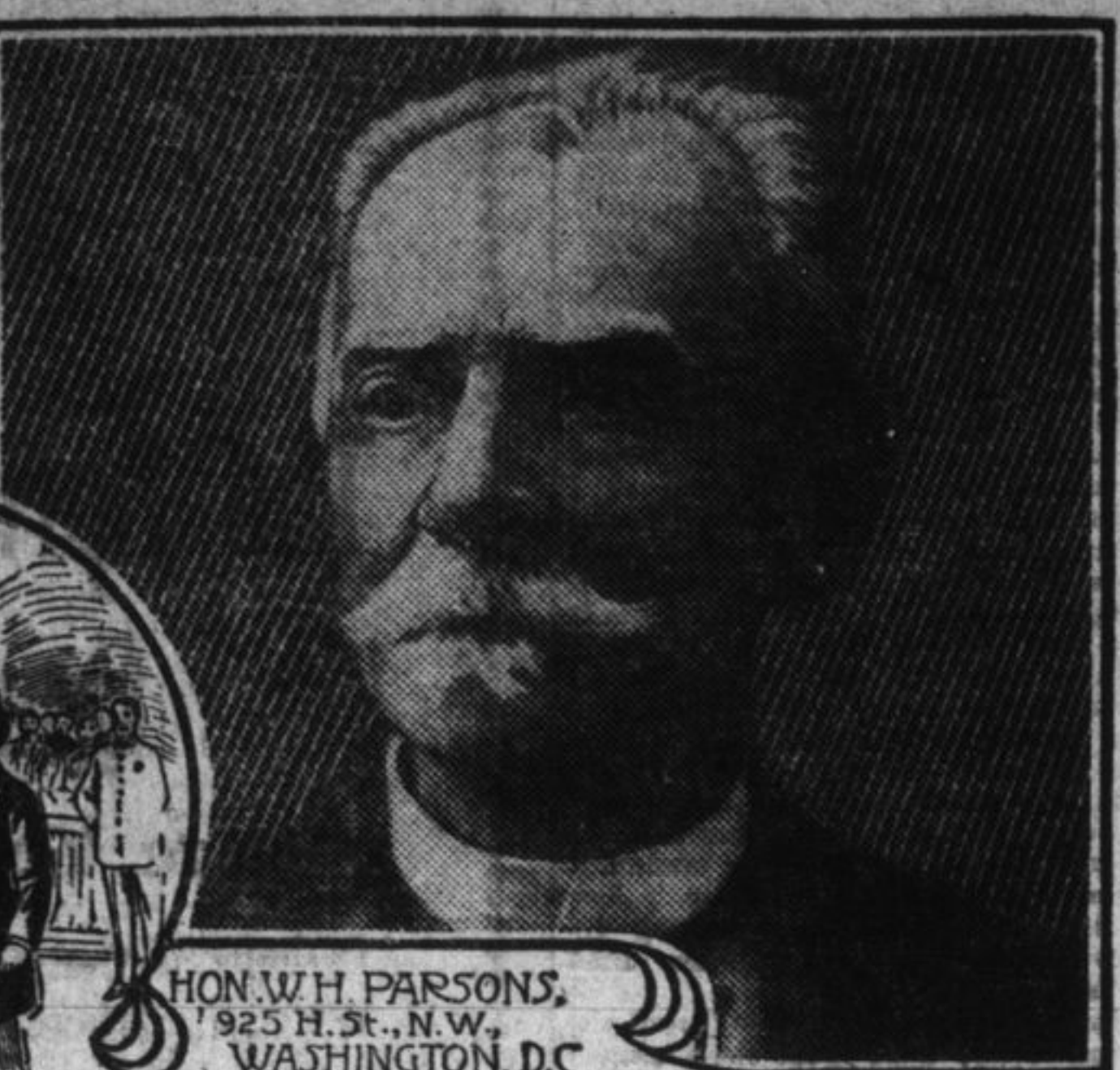

Lake Rate Increases Are Accepted. Milwaukee, April 10.—Representatives of the American insurance companies, doing business on the Great Lakes have accepted the agreement made some time ago by English underwriters. This increases the rates from 44 to 41 per cent., raises insurance obligations from \$40 to \$48.50 a gross ton and provides that losses must exceed \$500 before the underwriters are liable. The reason's business will be written before the vessels sail, in view of this agreement.
