These are sent to the factory. and the boots made and sent out. A "cowboy boot" is in a distinct class by itself. The log must be de carated with fancy lines and curves sewed into the leather, and above aferything else the heel must be at least two inches high, must curve inward from the back and the bottom of the heel must be very small, A cowboy takes especial pride in two things, his hat and his boots. He often pays \$50 for his hat, and the best of the cowboy boots cost from \$8 to \$16. The ordinary shoemaker cannot make boots to suit a true cowboy; he cannot get the heels right. And so the cowboy sends away for them, and pays a big price and ex-
