The work of executing the statue of the late Sir Henry Irving has been entrusted by the memorial committee to Thomas Brock, R.A.

Goldmark's new opera, founded on Shakespeare's "Winter Tale" will be produced at the Vienna Court Opera House early next season.

The revival of Hall Caine's "The Prodigal Son," at the London Adelphi has not proved a success, and the piece is to be withdrawn.

Mr. Comrie purposed to give performances of "Salome" in New York and in other large cities next fall before the regular season opens at the Metropolitan.

Mr. Comrie's opera "Peter Pan" continues to attract through at the Illinois, Chicago, and arrangements have been made to hold her there until April 14th.

Richard Strauss' "Salome" one of the most remarkable works in the whole history of opera, was produced at the Monnaie, Brussels, March 25th.

Lord Rosebery Not Going Over to Other Side.

London, April 12.—Lord Rosebery's thunderbolt against home rule, was considered by many as an excellent preliminary to going over to the other side, but that does not seem to be the case. His attitude resembles Mr. Balfour's. It represents the conservative and skeptical view of the democracy, and while it stands for the rights of property in the abstract, declares against any extension of property to the classes not now possessing it. The liberal attitude toward property may best be described as hostile only to the excessive accumulation and unchecked power of wealth—to the same tendency which has destroyed all the civilized societies of the past.
