A STARTLING STORY TOLD BY ONE OF THE THAW TRIAL JURORS.

How Verdict of Manslaughter Was Reached—The Jury Disregarded the Unwritten Law and the Testimony of the Experts.

New York, April 13.—"If it had not been for my difficulty with Juror Pfaff, which resulted in the breaking off of compromise negotiations, the jurors would have agreed on a verdict of manslaughter in the second degree of that I am convinced."

That was the amazing statement made by Juror Wilbur F. Steele. Mr. Steele then proceeded to tell a remarkable story of the proceedings in the jury room. He made it clear that the deliberations were the most sensational of any that have marked the conclusion of a great murder trial in this city.

Only one man really permanently changed sides, and that was Juror Dennee. All the other jurors, Steele, Pink and Frazer stood out for acquittal, and won over Dennee on the fifth ballot. Of the men for conviction, Frazer was the most stubborn.

The most dramatic incident was the personal clash between Steele and Pfaff. Juror Steele told all about this: "It was the result of persistent insulting insinuations on the part of Juror Pfaff against the minority of the jury which had resolutely stood out for a verdict of not guilty on the ground of insanity."

"I told him in plain language that he must cease; that because a man did not see things as he saw them he must not question the good faith of that other man. He never meant what I said and that I would not tolerate his half-veiled insults any further."
