Great daminhabitants were thrown into a panic. Earthquakes also occurred, yesterday, in various parts of Europe. The most noticeable were in Constantinople and its neighborhood and in the Tyrol, where a huge landslide resulted. There was also a severe shock at Askhabad in the Russian Trans-Caspian terri-
