SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTHWEST HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS

erson the sole head of a family, or make

eceived from an individual until that pplication has been disposed of.

A homesteader whose entry is in good tanding and not liable to cancellation, ay, subject to approval of Department, relinquish it in favour of father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister, If eligible, but to no one else, on filing designation of abandonment.

Where an entry is summarily cancelled or voluntarily abandoned, subsequent to institution of cancellation proceedings, the applicant for inspection will be entitled to prior right of entry.

Applicants for inspection must state in hat particulars the homesteader is in default, and if subsequently the statement is found to be incorrect in material particulars, the applicant will lose any prior right of recentry should the land become vacant, or if entry has been granted it may be summarily cancelled.

Duties—A settler is required to perform the conditions under one of the following plans:—

(1) At least six months' residence up-on and cultivation of the land in each

on and cultivation of the land in each year during the term-of three years.

(2) If the father (or mother, if the father is deceased) of a homesteader resides upon a farm in the vicinity of the land entered for by such homesteader the requirement as to residence may be attacked by such person residing with the father or mother.

(3) If the settler has his permanent estdence upon farming land owned by him in the vicinity of his homestead, the requirement may be satisfied by residence upon such land.

Before making application for patent the settler must give six months' notice writing to the Commissioner of Perinion Lands at Ottawa, of his intention to do so.

WEST MINING REGULATIONS.

Coal.—Coal Lands may be purchased at 10 per acre for soft coal and \$20 for anthracite. Not more than 320 acres can be acquired by one individual or company. Royalty at the rate of ten cents per ton of 2,000 pounds shall be collected on the gross output.

Quartz.—A person eighteen years of age, or over, baving discovered mineral in place, may locate a claim, 1,500x1,500 [col.]

The fee for recording a claim is \$5.

At least \$100 must be expended on the claim each year or paid to the mining recorder in lieu thereof. When \$500 has been expended or paid, the locator may, upon having a survey made, and upon omplying with other requirements, purchase the land at \$1 per acre.

The patent provides for the payment of royalty of 24 per cent on the sales.

Placer mining claims generally are 100 feet square entry fee \$5, renewable early.


