Belgrade, April 20.-Ex-Queen Na- No Man Need Pay More Than His talie, mother of the late king of Servia, has inherited a fortune of \$100,000 which has given her the possession of the Obrenovitch estates in Roumania. By this decree Dr. Petronievitch, the ate king's secretary, is rehabilitated and entitled to claim compensation from the Servian government for wrongful imprisonment. It will remembered that he was accused by the revolutionary cabinet of having illegal ly disposed of part of the revenues of these estates at King Alexander's bidding, and was condemned to two years'

The Roumanian courts have now affirmed that the lands in guestion were the personal property of the king, and that the king was perfectly justified directing his secretary to employ .the revenues for his majesty's private uses,
