

The fire broke out in the tenement house, which is situated on the west side of the K. & P. railway tracks Its origin is at present unknown. It started in the home of Mrs. Garratt, and on account of the high wind pre

vailing, spread very rapidly.

There was very little time to save anything, and besides losing about all of her furniture, Mrs. Garratt also suffered the loss of \$25 in the fire. At one time there were no less than seventeen buildings on fire, but the vil agers kept such a good watch that as soon as sparks dropped on house-tops, they were killed by the bucket brigade.
