



SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTHWEST HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS Conversion may be a farce or a fact.

Inasmuch as it is the selfish acceptance of an evangelistic offer of pardon and paradise through the mediation person the sole head of a family, or male of a slain Saviour, it is practically a farce. Such a conversion is both selfish and superficial. But insofar as Application for homestead entry or in-

spection must be made in person by the applicant at the office of the local Agent or Sub-agent.
