RARE-BOGUS GEMS.

Small Rubies and Sapphires Enlarged to Any Size.

The discovery of a Parisian manufacturer who is making rubies and sapphires of large size by an ingenious process is likely to cause trouble among English, as it has done already among French, jewelers and dealers in precious stones.

A London gentleman, who has learned the secret of the process from the manufacturer himself, said that these rubies and sapphires are made by taking the remnants of cut stones, and also small and badly shaped stones, which by themselves are of little value, and making them up by means of electrical furnace and high-pressure moulds to any size required.

"I have seen rubies and sapphires thus manufactured ranging in size up to half an inch," he said. "These stones are called 'constructed' rubies and 'constructed' sapphires, and they possess all the quality of the original stone. Indeed, the only way to detect the difference between the 'constructed' and original stone is to look at the grain, which, through a powerful microscope.

London, April 23.—In the House of Commons Campbell-Bannerman stated he was unaware of any country which on the whole gives so favorable treatment to self-governing colonies as the United Kingdom.
