SECOND SUEZ CANAL PROJECT BACKED BY BRITISH CAPITAL

Concession is Only Matter of a Few Weeks-Thought in Berlin That Move is Meant to Checkmate Germany's Asiatic Ambitions. New York, April 27.-The Herald correspondent at Berlin has sent the following cable despatch: I am, as usual tonight by a prominent British resident of Constantinople in intimate touch with palace circles in that city, of the construction of a second Suez canal, supported solely by British capital in British hands, has passed beyond the stage of mere speculation and has now entered upon a definite form. A concession is only a matter of a few weeks.

London, April 27.-Uncle Sam's navy yards will benefit by the slackness at Woolwich Arsenal, where the liberal government's policy of economy has involved wholesale discharges of skilled workmen. The men who are being turned away as surplus to the requirements of the navy are among the best of their kind in the world. The number of men employed at Woolwich is now nearly 2,000 short of the average in time of peace, and the greatest distress prevails in the town. Thousands of women and children are starving, while tradesmen who depend on busy times at the arsenal for their prosperity are facing ruin.
