The American Face.

We are an electric and thunderous people. To the Russian, the metropolis stood revealed from the very first moment as an implacable mechanism, incessantly grinding away at the bodies and souls of men—as a something positively Apocalyptic. He writes: "Fervid life bubbles around as soup on a hob. People rush, whirl, disappear in this eddy of the ocean. The city roars and engulfs one after another in its insatiable maw. Some of the heroes (the bronze statues in the public squares) have let their hands droop, others have uplifted them, spreading them out above people's heads, just as if they wanted to say, 'Stop! This is not life, this is madness!' and all are out of place amidst a fierce roar of avidity, in close bondage to a grim phantasm of stone, glass and iron."

Violent Earthquake Severely Shakes Canada
