

THOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTHWEST HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS Anv even numbered section of Domin-Wat Provisces, execpting 8 and 26, not reserved, n ty be homesteaded by any person the sole head of a family, or male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter section, of 160 acres, more

Application for homestead entry or in ection must be made in person by the applicant at the office of the local Agent or Sub-agent.

An application for entry or inspection made personally at any Sub-agent's office may be wired to the local Agent by the Sub-agent, at the expense of the applicant, and if the land applied for is vacant on receipt of the telegram such application is to have priority and the land will be held until the necessary papers to complete the transaction are eceived by mail.

eceived by mail. In case of "personation" the entry will be summarily cancelled and the appli-An applicant for inspection must be eligible for homestead entry, and only one application for inspection will be eccived from an individual until that pplication has been disposed of.

A homesteader whose entry is in good tanding and not liable to cancellation, any, subject to approval of Department, relinquish it in favour of father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister. son, daughter, brother or sister, is eligible, but to no one else, on filing declaration of abandonment.

Where an entry is summarily cancelled or voluntarily abandoned, subsequent to institution of cancellation proceedings, the applicant for inspection will be entitled to prior right of entry. Applicants for inspection must state in hat particulars the homesteader is in default, and if subsequently the statement is found to be incorrect in materany prior right of re-entry should the land become vacant, or if entry has been granted it may be summarily cancelled.

Duties—A settler is required to perform the conditions under one of the

following plans:—
(1) At least six months' residence upyear during the term of three years.

(2) If the father (or mother, if the father is deceased) of a homesteader resides upon a farm in the vicinity of the land entered for by such homesteader the requirement as to residence may be atisfied by such person residing with the father or mother.

(3) If the settler has his permanent esidence upon farming land owned by him in the vicinity of his homestead, the requirement may be satisfied by residence upon such land.

WEST MINING REGULATIONS. Coal.—Coal Lands may be purchased at 19 per acre for soft coal and \$20 for anthracite. Not more than 320 acres can be acquired by one individual or company. Royalty at the rate of ten collected on the gross output.

Quartz.—A person eighteen years of age,
or over, having discovered mineral in
place, may locate a claim, 1,500x1,500

The fee for recording a claim is \$. At least \$100 must be expended on the claim each year or paid to the mining recorder in lieu thereof. When \$500 has been expended or paid, the locator may, upon having a survey made, and upon omplying with other requirements, purchase the land at \$1 per acre.

The patent provides for the payment of royalty of 2½ per cent on the sales.

Placer mining claims generally are 100 feet square entry fee \$5, renewable

An applicant may obtain two leases to dredge for gold of five miles each for a term of twenty years, renewable at the discretion of the Minister of the Interior.
The lessee shall have a dredge in operation within one season from the date of the lease for each five miles. Rental 10 per annum for each mile of river leased. Royalty at the rate of 23 per cent collected on the output after it exeeds \$10,000.
