Legal Status of Chocolate. London, May 3.—The Grimsby sanitary department decided, yesterday, that milk chocolate is a food and not a sweetmeat. The decision was given in a case in which a refreshment house-keeper was summoned under an ordinance by police for breaking the Sabbath by selling chocolate to his customers. The defendant contended that as it was a combination of Swiss milk and cocoa it was entitled to rank as refreshment. The magistrate upheld this view and dismissed the summons.

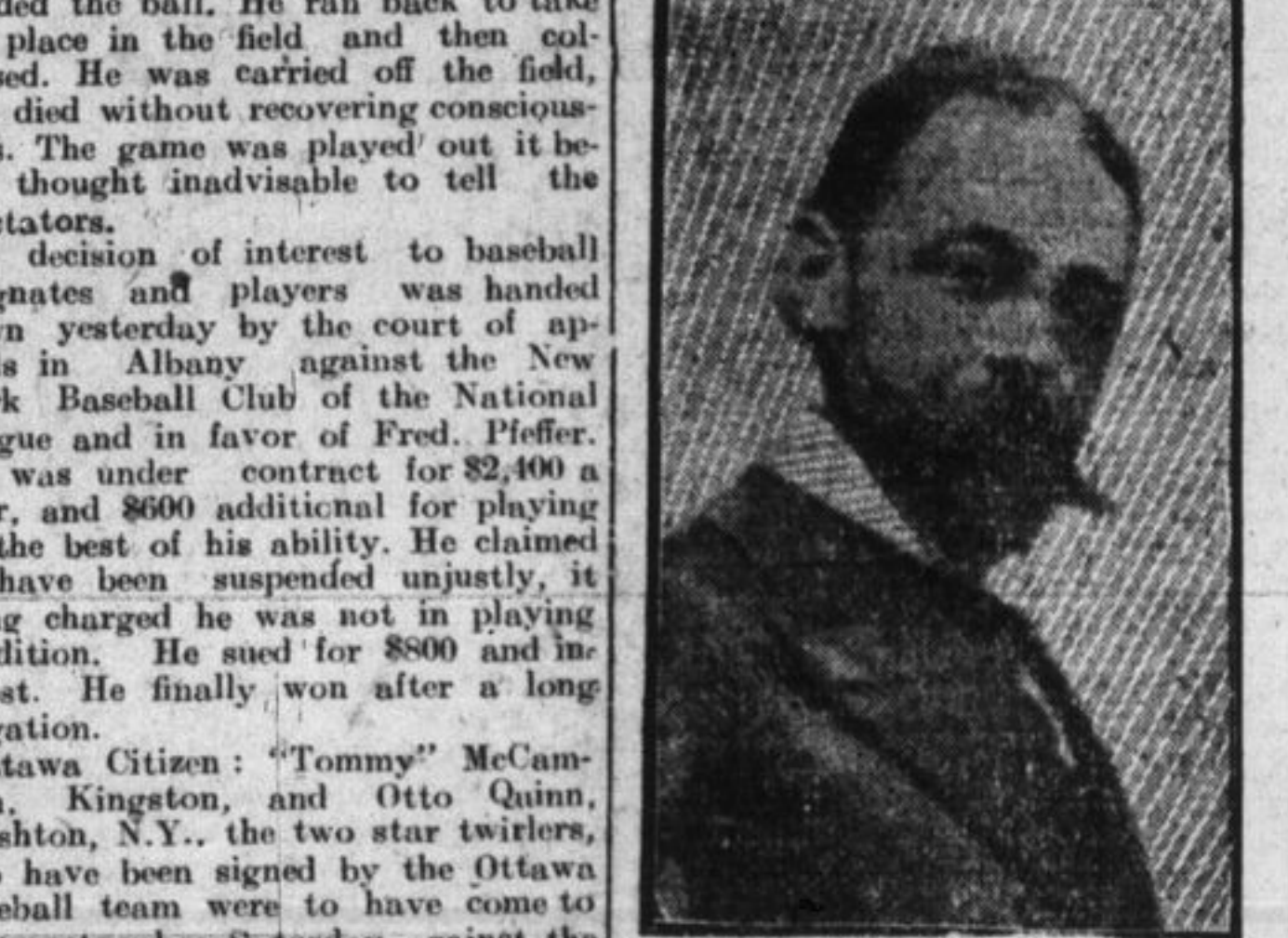

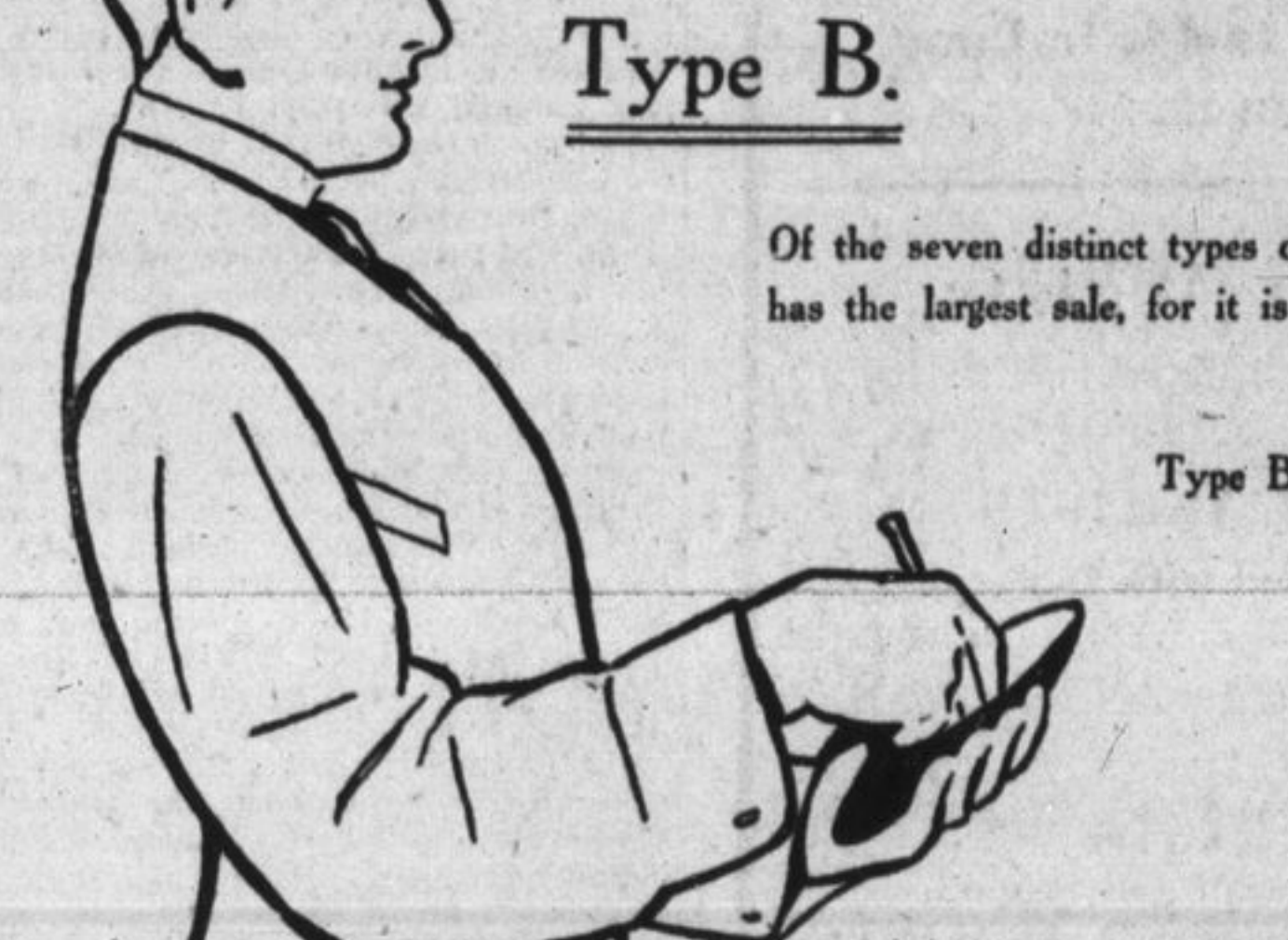

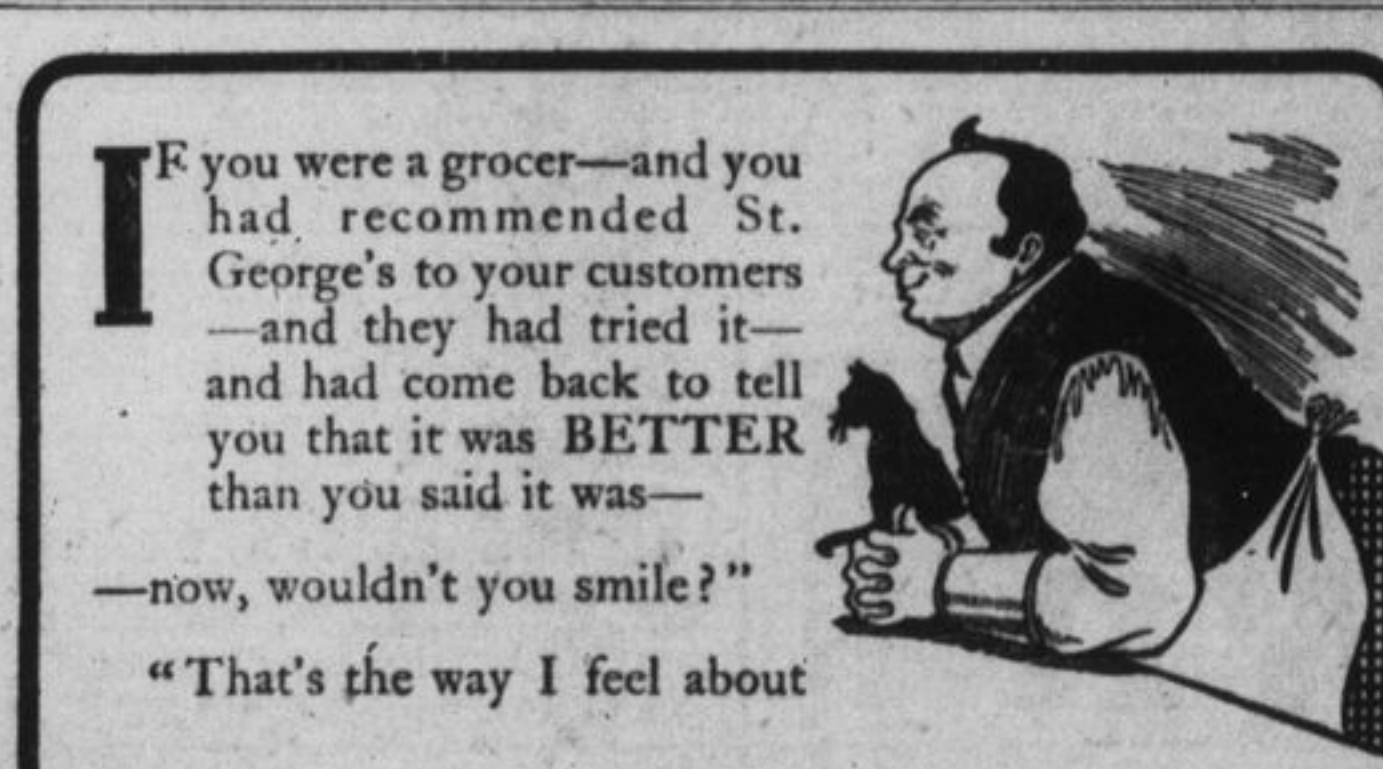
