SOME CIVIC MATTERS

DUE NOTICE SHOULD BE GIVEN THE PEOPLE

Before Roads Are Rebuilt—City Buildings a Place For Sanitary Inspection—City Council on Monday.

Before the city can proceed to rebuild the roads, it will have to give the people a lengthy notice of its intention, so that before operations are begun, all drains and sewers may be completed. Last month, the lower block of Princess street was covered over with stone and this week the steam roller went over it. Now, the street has been opened for the laying of some service pipes. It would be folly for the city to start ahead and build roads before it was ascertained that there would be no more excavation. Six months' notice would require to be given. There are some blocks which are not likely to be opened again for years, and they could be rebuilt, but there are many others in which mains and services have still to be laid.

The City Council. Probably the first place that the city's plumbing inspector should examine are the city buildings, which are in anything but a sanitary condition. Ald. Angrove, as chairman of the city property committee, should pay the inspection fee and invite the city engineer to sniff the sewers outside of some portions of the municipal structure on Ontario street.

First On The List. There will be very little for the city council to do on Monday evening as none of the committees had anything of much importance to recommend. Two of the committees had no meetings during the week, on account of there being no quorum. The money by-laws will again come up, and the city treasurer will be on hand to explain some matters that were entirely misunderstood by some of the aldermen.

TORONTO AND QUEEN'S. Why Rev. Dr. Falconer Was Appointed. "Do you know why Rev. Dr. Falconer was chosen president of Toronto University?" asked a member of the board of education. "If you don't, I'll tell you why. You, doubtless, know that he's one of Canada's foremost Presbyterian public men.
