Application for homestead entry or in-pection must be made in person by the applicant at the office of the local Agent An application for entry or inspection made personally at any Sub-agent's office may be wired to the local Agent by the Sub-agent, at the expense of the applicant, and if the land applied for is vacant on receipt of the telegram such application is to have priority and the land will be held until the necessary papers to complete the transaction are

In case of "personation" the entry will be summarily cancelled and the appli-cant will forfest all priority of claim. An applicant for inspection must be eligible for homestead entry, and only pne application for inspection will be eceived from an individual until that pplication has been disposed of. A homesteader whose entry is in good tanding and not liable to cancellation. relinquish it in favour of father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister, if eligible, but to no one else, on filing de-Where an entry is summarily cancelled or voluntarily abandoned, subsequent to institution of cancellation proceedings, the applicant for inspection will be ontitled to prior right of entry. Applicants for inspection must state in hat particulars the homesteader is in default, and if subsequently the statement is found to be incorrect in material particulars, the applicant will lose any prior right of re-entry should the land become vacant, or if entry has been granted it may be summarily cancelled.
