Application for homestead entry or inpection must be made in person by the applicant at the office of the local Agent or Sub-agent.

An application for entry or inspection made personally at any Sub-agent's other

may be wired to the local Agent by the Sub-agent, at the expense of the applicant, and if the land applied for is vacant on receipt of the telegram such application is to have priority and the land will be held until the necessary papers to complete the transaction are eceived by mail.

In case of "personation" the entry will be summarily cancelled and the applicant will forfeit all priority of claim. An applicant for inspection must be eligible for homestead entry, and only one application for inspection will be eceived from an individual until that pplication has been disposed of. A homesteader whose entry is in good tanding and not liable to cancellation. relinquish it in favour of father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister, eligible, but to no one else, on filing declaration of abandonment. Where an entry is summarily cancelled or voluntarily abandoned, subsequent to institution of cancellation proceedings, the applicant for inspection will be entitled to prior right of entry. Applicants for inspection must state hat particulars the homesteader is in

default, and if subsequently the state-ment is found to be incorrect in material particulars, the applicant will lose any prior right of re-entry should the granted it may be summarily cancelled Duties-A settler is required to perform the conditions under one of the following plans :on and cultivation of the land in each year during the term of three years.
(2) If the father (or mother, if the father is deceased) of a homesteader
