BOARD OF TRADE HELD ITS ANNUAL MEETING LAST EVENING.

W. T. Minnes Re-elected President—Work of the Year—Mr. Berningham Says Power Can Be Produced Cheaper Here Than Brought.

The annual meeting of the Board of Trade was held in its rooms last evening, and there was a very large attendance of members. President W. T. Minnes occupied the chair. All the reports read showed that the board had closed a most successful year. Twelve years ago it was a lethargic organization, whereas to-day there is not a more energetic body in the city.

C. A. Macpherson presented the industrial committee report. This committee has been most active and has been in communication with quite a number of companies which were seeking places of settlement. It had been able to present to the city council two smelter propositions which will be voted upon by the property owners on the 25th.

The Power Question.

C. Berningham, in speaking for the power committee, made some very pointed remarks. He declared that he had some time ago looked carefully into the proposal of bringing electric power into Kingston from outside places. In his investigation he had the assistance of J. M. Campbell, the city's expert.

Election of Officers.

The election of officers resulted as follows: Honorary presidents—Hon. William Hart, M.P., Edw. J. H. Pease, M.P.P., President—W. T. Minnes. First vice-president—E. T. Stacey. Second vice-president—H. W. Richardson.

Mr. Pease was called upon by the president to speak. He congratulated the board and the city upon the fine exhibition of unity in its business which had shown during the past year.

BOARD OF HEALTH THE MEDICAL HEALTH OFFICER INSTRUCTED

To Wait Upon the Board of Education Regarding a Nurse to Report Upon Contagious Diseases Among the Children.

The board of health met yesterday afternoon. Present were S. S. Corbett (chairman), Dr. Evans, John Lemmon and Dr. Hanley.

Dr. Evans brought up the question of having some one to look after the public school children in regard to contagious diseases. The board adopted its resolution instructing the medical health officer and discuss with it the advisability of appointing a qualified nurse for the purpose.

Another matter was brought to the attention of the board by Dr. Evans, and that was with reference to the slaughtering of cattle within the city limits and depositing the remnants of the carcasses on local ground.

Matters pertaining to the annual banquet came up for discussion, and it was decided to extend an invitation to T. D. Patton, general secretary of the Ottawa Y.M.C.A., to be the guest of the association on that occasion, and to give an address on "Calcutta," the same to be illustrated by views on canvas.

The board granted the general secretary leave of absence to attend the Barrield military camp.
