**THE GOVERNOR THROWN DOWN.**  
There has been a vote of the senate of New York state on a governor's recommendation, concerning the removal of a state official, and the bosses have triumphed. Mr. Hughes had been elected as a reformer, pledged to act independently and to insist upon efficiency in the public service according to his conception of it. Early in his official career he assured himself that Mr. Kelsey, superintendent of insurance, was wholly incompetent for the work of his office, and suggested his retirement.  
If there was any subject in which Mr. Hughes was posted it was insurance. He had only a year before contended his investigation of it, and the legislature had adopted the laws which he drafted. He was an expert, therefore, in the business, and he was surprised to find that Mr. Kelsey had not made any of the changes which on the contrary he kept in office some of the men whose relations with the insurance companies and service generally were so objectionable. The situation became painfully apparent when Mr. Hughes called Mr. Kelsey to his office and admitted him to an examination which revealed all that the governor suspected and made a change in office more than ever desirable.  
For weeks the issue had been before the state senate, which according to law, had to approve of a dismissal before it could take effect. In all that time the party bosses had been

LEGISLATURE FOR IRELAND.  
To-day the imperial parliament will hear the government's proposal with regard to home rule in Ireland. It will be an important announcement, and it will be a marvel if the government is a unit upon it.  
One can recall the attempt of Mr. Gladstone, with a strong government, to launch a scheme of legislative reform, so far as Ireland was concerned. He seemed to have the support of his cabinet until the measure was declared, and then it was discovered that he had lost the support of two of his strongest colleagues, the Duke of Devonshire and Mr. Chamberlain. History is not, merely, repeating itself, and yet it is intimated that Mr. Asquith and Mr. Haldane, chancellor of the exchequer and secretary of war, are not in harmony with the premier upon this subject.  
Some day Ireland will have what provinces of Canada now have, a parliament for the consideration of purely local questions, and if it is successful with a minor degree of authority, it may later secure the larger boon of a parliament and a government which will have powers and functions similar to those of the Canadian federation.

There has to be a modest acquiring, however, and an experiment, and Ireland ought to be as ready for this as the Transvaal, and would be, if John Redmond became as ultra a Britisher in every way as General Botha appears to be.  
**WHERE THE MATTER STANDS.**  
The board of education's special committee will meet the committee from Queen's College this evening, respecting the school of pedagogy. There is no telling what the outcome will be, for there is really no opposition before the board, and this proposition should come from the college people as "the party of the first part," or the party which is primarily concerned. The trustees of the institute and public schools are not offering anything to the college, but the college wants the school of pedagogy, and must have the schools for practice, observation and technical instruction.  
It is understood, through a preliminary survey of the situation, that more accommodation will be necessary; that the efficiency of the staffs must be increased, (if possible); that the equipment must be improved, and all this costs money. The city can hardly be expected to supply it, for as a popular local institution the college has not been treated in a parsimonious manner.  
The point of greatest concern is as to the organization of the faculty of this new school. The head will be responsible for the work of the faculty (which will be composed of the city teachers), and the school board should not be asked to abandon any of the control which it now exercises. The agreements which are entered into between the school board and the education departments, with respect to the Normal schools, may not apply here but if they do there may be some difficulty in reaching a basis where all present differences may be reconciled.

**EDITORIAL NOTES.**  
The Tory papers have had Mr. Hyman in several places lately, including London, England, and on to Japan. All the while he is in California, in very bad health, and with very little sign of improvement.  
The boycott has just been approved by the privy council. The venerable court, that has hitherto represented all that was adhering to the eternal fitness of things, has been handing out some astonishing judgments.  
Goldwin Smith does not think it wise that Canada should copy New Zealand's position system. A colony with a public debt of £26 7s. 4d. is not a pattern in the way of wise or judicious financing.

**LaPasse** has seven arguments against the new postal arrangements, so far as Canada is concerned, and the last one is the more important. It is that "from a general point of view they constitute a general administrative error."  
The works department will have to talk payment, persistently and intelligently, if it wants the \$75,000 by-law to carry. There is apparently a good deal of opposition to the expenditure of large sums in any kind of pavements.  
A parliamentary return, handed out most reluctantly, shows that under the rule the Irish public service was loaded up with political favourites and incompetents. A more shameful abuse of the public service cannot be imagined.

**Dr. Mundell** has sounded a sensible warning note. Something should be done to guard against the spread of disease in the schools. There are many cases of scarlet fever in the city. What is being done to guard against the spread of it?  
It looks as if Canada got the worst of the deal in the postal arrangements. The newspaper publishers at any rate have got the worst of it, and for it, according to one account, "a clique of the Canadian Press Association," is to be cordially thanked.

**The New York Commercial** advises Kelsey, the state superintendent of insurance, to resign at once. He has been vindicated by the bosses, who refused the governor's demand for suspension. Now, says the Commercial, let Kelsey get out. It is hard but sound advice.

**News From The Fair Grounds.**  
The track at the fair grounds is in good condition for the Victoria Day races, and with favorable weather should be no slouch for the racing. At present there are twenty-four horses stabled at the grounds in charge of their trainers. They are worked out every day. The running race for a purse of \$200 promises to be the event of the day.

**Baseball At The Cricket Field.**  
Space is at a premium on the cricket field. Every afternoon a large number of baseball teams practice. The juniors are entering into the game this year, and should make quite a show-up before the season is advanced. The parks committee will be asked to roll the diamond on the cricket field before Victoria day. The senior series of the City League will start on May 18th.

**In Line With Public Opinion.**

The action of the Westinghouse company in issuing \$5,000,000 of stock to stockholders of record at 75 per cent share, which is a price above the market price for the past few weeks, is notable instance of a great corporation putting itself in line with the new public opinion in regard to capitalization. The general custom has been for corporations to issue new stock at par when the market price of the outstanding shares was very much higher, but the Westinghouse issues its stock at or above the market price instead of at the par price. The old custom has prevailed for many years and has been subjected to comparatively little criticism until lately when it has been condemned as a form of stock watering.

**The Mary Ann Vote.**

In Wisconsin, the other day, we are told, the legislature resorted to the "Mary Ann" system of voting to break a deadlock in an appointment. A good many may be puzzled to know what is meant by the "Mary Ann" system of voting. It provides that each member of the legislature shall vote his first choice at the first meeting of the legislature, and his second choice at the same time. The second-choice votes are to be added to the first-choice votes in case the first choice does not result in a nomination. It is intended to take into consideration the average of popularity. The successful candidate under the system now possibly not have the greatest number of votes as first choice, but he must be on the average higher in favor than any of his opponents. It is a useful method of breaking caucuses deadlocks.

**FETED IN FRANCE.**  
Visit of Lancashire Lads to Famous City.  
Lille, May 7.—The visit of the band of the 2nd Battalion South Lancashire Regiment has been an unequalled success. The Englishmen are the heroes of the hour. Invitations pour in upon them, and they are being loaded with presents, chiefly of cigars, cigarettes, chocolate and the confectionery for which the town is famous. One man has received three hampers of champagne. The concert on Sunday drew a huge audience, and \$1,200 was collected for the French charity "Arbre de Noel."  
To-day a selection of music was played in the garden of the British consulate. A football match between the Englishmen and the French Iris Club resulted in a victory for the latter by 6 goals to 3. A final concert was held in the Grand Place this evening, and evoked immense enthusiasm.
