COMMERCIAL MATTERS.

What is Going On in the Business World—The Markets.

A. L. Dowar, Chicago, appointed general manager of the Montreal Bank, has moved to Toronto.
The delay of Galt's capitalizations continues. Last week a new mining company was incorporated, with a capital of \$2,500,000.
The Republic of Panama contains about 20,181,000 acres of land, of which about 70,000 acres are under cultivation.

A dispatch from Japan complains that the price of Canadian wheat is too high; another from Japan denotes an increase in the quality of Canadian flour used.

The Duluth Commercial-Record says that spring wheat areas of United States will be ten to twelve per cent. less than last year on account of late seeding in the North-west.

Sweet potatoes are principally used in the States to make alcohol, the yield being 10 to 11 per cent. The present price is about 18 cents. United States production is about 10,000,000 bushels for the year. The 2 per cent quarterly dividend call for \$60,000 per month or \$118,000 per quarter.

The fire loss of the United States and Canada for the month of April, as compiled from the Journal of Commerce, shows a total of \$21,925,900, against \$22,501,150 in April, 1905. ARE MANY VICTIMS

MATRIMONY THE BAIT TO CATCH UNWARY

Supposed Notorious Women Swindlers Are Arrested—Letters Found in Which Money to Pay Railroad Fare to the Altar Was Demanded.

Evansville, Ind., May 8.—In the arrest of Mrs. Viola Lancaster and her daughter, the police believe they have two international swindlers who defrauded people in both the United States and Canada through matrimonial agencies. Chief Brenneke has letters from people in all parts of the country, who have written to him for information concerning the two women, claiming that they had sent them money.

One letter states that the writer had advertised for a wife and that one of the women answered and promised to marry him.

A letter later conveyed the information that she was sick and needed money, wanted to buy clothes before her marriage, or wanted money for her railroad fare to the home of the intended husband.

In many cases, it is said, the money was sent, and when the women thought they would ask for more money to pay the mother's as well as the daughter's fare.

TAKES EFFECT AUGUST.

Inspectors Will Look After Canned Stuff, Etc.

Ottawa, May 8.—This week's Canada Gazette will contain a proclamation stating that the act to provide for inspection of canned food products, meals and other articles, which last session of parliament, will come into force on August 1st next. Regulations in respect to duties of inspectors, methods of inspection, etc., are now being drafted. The government will appoint about forty-five inspectors, who will be under Dr. Rutherford as inspector-general. The total cost of enforcing the act is estimated at \$75,000 per year. The salaries of the inspectors will be \$1,200 per year.

STARVED ON TREK.

Eleven Thousand Perished on the March.

Cape Town, May 8.—It is stated that the Hereros, finding it useless further to resist the Germans in German South West Africa, trekked northward with the intention of forming a new settlement in the neighborhood of Lake Nagami, and eleven thousand of the tribe died of starvation en route. Only four thousand arrived, later, in terrible privation.

Brooks Again Challenger.

Brooks, the Kingston wrestler, has challenged the winner of the match between the English champion wrestlers, formerly of England, on May 6th. Brooks offers to wrestle on or before the 15th of May, for a side bet of \$500. Great cheers greeted Brooks as he entered the opera house at Cobalt, to challenge the winner, who proved to be Aeton. The latter secured the first fall from Strong in twelve minutes and nineteen seconds. The second fall went to Strong in five minutes, and the third to Aeton in two minutes. A large crowd witnessed the match.

THE VERY LATEST CALLED FROM ALL OVER THE WORLD.

THOMAS MAGWOOD IS MADE SHERIFF OF THE COUNTY OF PERTH

He Was Defeated in the General Provincial Elections—His Record Comes Now—To Hold Summer School at Guelph.

Toronto, May 8.—Thomas Magwood, ex-M.P.P. for North Perth, has been appointed sheriff of Perth county, in succession to the late John Hossie. The new sheriff was first returned to the legislature for North Perth at a by-election in 1890. He was born in East Flamboro township, in 1851. Mr. Magwood is a farmer. He was defeated in the general election of 1898.

The education department is considering the advisability of arranging to hold this year's summer classes for public school teachers at the Guelph Agricultural College. This will enable the department to use the normal school classes for those of the separate school teachers, who, under the act of last session, must qualify within a specific time in accordance with the regulations of the department.

Judge Winchester and C. S. James, the arbitrators agreed upon to settle the dispute between the milk producers and the farmers, had their first session, this morning, to decide upon the method of conducting the arbitration. It was agreed that committees of six from each side should appear before the arbitration, on Tuesday next, to state their case, then if they cannot come to an agreement evidence will have to be taken. No lawyers are to be allowed to appear for either side.
