Coal.—Coal Lands may be purchased at 10 per acre for soft coal and \$20 for anthracite. Not more than 320 acres can be acquired by one individual of company. Royalty at the rate of tent cents per ton of 2,000 pounds shall be collected on the gross output.

Quarts.—A person eighteen years of age, or over, having discovered mineral implace, may locate a claim, 1,500x1,500 feet.

The fee for recording a claim is &... At least \$100 must be expended on

claim each year or paid to the mining recorder in lieu thereof. When \$500 has been expended or paid, the lotator may, upon having a survey made, and upon omplying with other requirements, purchase the land at \$1 per acre.


