'Amongst all the colonial prime ministers, General Botha attracted more attention than the rest. There is indeed no getting over the fact that the English are a people of generous nstincts. Justin McCarthy, in his book, entitled, 'History of Our Times' notes the fact that at the coronation of Queen Victoria, the popular hero was Marshal Soult, the special ambassador sent by the French govern sympathy was in the fact that he had valiantly fought the English army in Spain, It is the same with Botha. The English give him credit for the cour age and success which characterized his actions against their armies in the Transvaal.
