SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTHWEST HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS

Any one numbered section of Dominion land in Manitoba or the Northwest, as provided in section 20, not reserved, a 1/2 section homesteaded by any person the sole head of a family, or single over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter section, of 160 acres, more or less.

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTHWEST WEST MINING REGULATIONS

Coal Lands may be purchased at 10 per acre for soft coal and \$20 for anthracite. Not more than 320 acres can be acquired by one individual or company. Royalty at the rate of ten cents per ton of 2,000 pounds should be collected on the gross output.
