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SEEK HIS RELEASE
ALEX SHAIRPE, NOW SERVING FIFTEEN YEARS.

Was Sentenced at Peterboro in 1900, on Charge of Man-slaughter.

An effort is being made to secure the release from the Kingston penitentiary of Alexander Shairpe, of Peterboro, sentenced to fifteen years' imprisonment for having shot William Hull, in the autumn of 1900. The prisoner is now nearly seventy years of age. Rev. E. A. Langfield, rector of St. Luke's church, Peterboro, has circulated a petition, which will be forwarded to the minister of justice. He visited the prisoner here at the "pen" recently, and was so impressed with the pathetic circumstances of the case that he decided to take active steps to seek his release. He has also written an open letter to the people of Peterboro and county of Peterboro setting forth the facts of the case.

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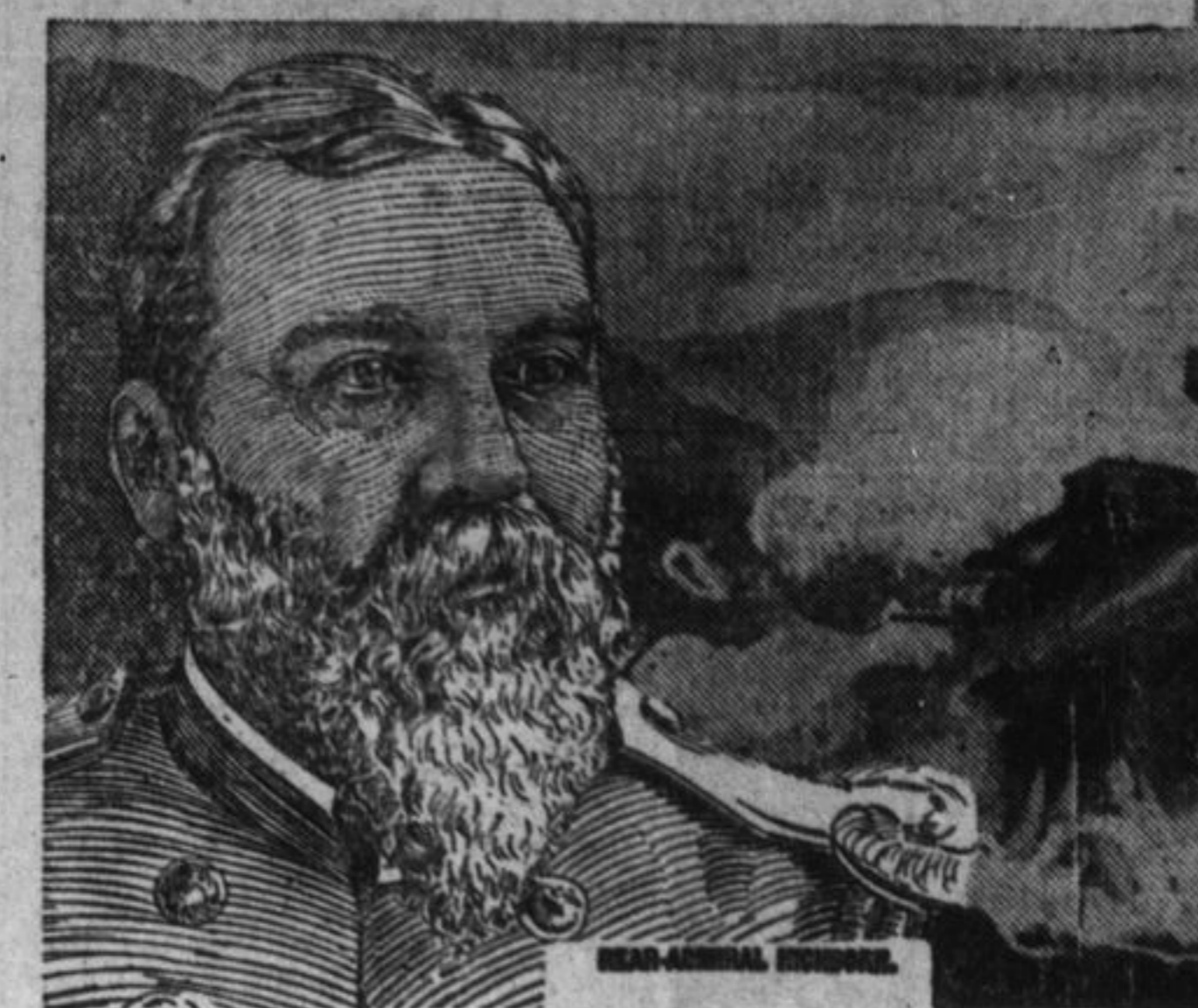

Suing Many Newspapers.

Toronto, May 22.—Actions against newspapers for illegal libel, have resulted from the Perkins murder trial at Cayuga. The damages claimed altogether amount to \$212,000 and the complainants are Ralph Currie, Mattie Perkins and Thomas A. McDonald, who were all mentioned in connection with the case. The newspapers sued are in Toronto, Hamilton, St. Catharines, St. Thomas and Stratford.
