Daily Whig. THE PEOPLE ARE AGITATED.

The Orangeville abortion case has assumed a new phase by the published explanation of the crown prosecutor. One Jackson was on his defence as the chief offender, and one Douglas as his aider and abettor, the first named being the person that supplied the pills that were supposed to be destructive of life, and the last named as the person who sold them, knowing that they were meant and designated by their use. Two days were occupied in hearing the evidence, which seemed to be direct enough and to point towards a conviction. Then there was a surprise. The defence withdrew the plea of "not guilty," and put in its place the plea of "guilty," and the court allowed him to go on suspended sentence, after pronouncing upon the heinousness of his crime. It was assumed that some defect existed, some reason why this extraordinary course should be adopted. But all was hazy and in doubt until the crown prosecutor spoke, and in a letter to the press he has broken the long silence. He has intimated that the evidence was disappointing to him, that it was not as strong as some people surmised, and that weakness was apparent to the defence. He made no advance towards the compromise, but he accepted the condition that prevailed, deeming it better that "Jackson should leave the court room convicted rather than that he should secure an acquittal as a result of medical theories."

The mystery deepens. The crown prosecutor has all the evidence at hand, as he says, but he does not lift the veil so that one can see things as he does. Meanwhile public feeling is running high, and the demand is that the attorney-general investigate all the facts. In the opinion of the judge of the offence of the accused was of the most abominable kind, and yet he goes without any check, save the rebuke which was given by the bench. Abortion is a crime which cannot be condoned under any circumstances, and the public conscience in this case, is not to be stifled by any plausible performances.

MEANING OF EMPIRE DAY. This is Empire Day in the schools. It is the day set apart by statute for perpetuating the memory of a good and righteous monarch. Queen Victoria represented virtue, as well as power, in her person, and her life, as embodied in the history of her times, serves to inspire the people into noble service. It is a mistake to suppose that a king or queen is blessed in every way. The responsibilities and cares of state weigh heavily upon the individual, and the wonder is that Victoria's reign was so long and remarkable, in view of the many anxieties which came to her as the head of a great empire. The school children are invited to contemplate her character and her place in history. At the same time they are invited to contemplate the extension of empire, to comprehend its aims, its government, its laws and institutions, its superiority when compared with any other nation. The king-to-day rules over 400,000,000 of subjects, residing in Europe, Asia, Africa, and America, and held together by a bond of the heartiest loyalty. Empire day is associated with the birthday of the late Queen Victoria, and is supposed to be occupied in varied and delightful exercises. It is designed, principally, to recall the marked advances in empire building during the sixty-three years of the queen's reign, but it is designed, also, to bring out and emphasize the qualities of the British people that have distinguished them from all others. The minister of education has succinctly put the case when, in a circular dealing with the features of the occasion, he remarks: "The 'Empire Day' movement is an effort throughout the king-emperor's dominions to remind all British subjects of the virtues which make a good citizen, such as loyalty, patriotism, courage, endurance, respect for, and obedience to, lawful authority, and to encourage self-sacrifice for the public good; to teach all, and especially the young, the sacredness of the trust committed to them, and to inspire them with determination to do their duty, and should be promoted by every British subject."

EDITORIAL NOTES. Politics in the Orangeville case? Surely not. The favouritism of party has not hitherto made itself felt in the administration of justice.

Control of the schools and staffs and larger compensation for their use is the slogan of the school trustees on the School of Pedagogy question. A postal rate war is now on, at the instigation of Canadian and American governments, and the users of the mails are realizing that something has happened. The situation here, so far as the School of Pedagogy is concerned, is unique. There is, therefore, no great guide to action by the experience of any other place.

The Irish convention has spoken. It pronounces against the Irish Council Bill, and that means the rejection of it. The demand is made that Ireland be given, as much as the Transvaal, namely, full self-government. The Transvaal, however, took what it could get. The longshoremen's strike in Montreal has collapsed. The men want arbitration now, and the employers will not have it. Failure is written on this labour rising, because the men would not accept the mediation for which the Lemieux Act provided. It conveys a lesson which will be remembered.

The Toronto News favours the secrecy of the provincial university governors' proceedings, because the business under the government was private. But the government had to defend its action in the legislature. The governors are not required to walk the plank anywhere, and they are annually spending hundreds of thousands of dollars.

The civic division of the Merchants' Association of New York demands better streets and better care of the pavements. The big complaint there is in every city, is against the loose way in which openings are made in the highways for various purposes. What is the use of laying an expensive pavement if it is to be continually attacked and dug up?

The education department has under preparation two new courses which must be followed by the Schools of Pedagogy. Until the regulation is approved there is no telling what the effect will be upon the schools for practice and observation purposes. The negotiations meanwhile, between the school board and Queen's College, cannot be effective.

TO SETTLE DISPUTE About a Water Site—An Old Government Surveyor. Henry Laws, of the surveyor-general's branch of the department of the interior, Ottawa, while here will decide upon the dispute regarding the old wooden stable site leased at one time to ex-Ald. William Allan, situated adjacent to Knapp's hotel, and now used by the M. T. company. There are over twenty-two applicants for boat home sites and a joint survey of the grounds was to have been started this morning. It is understood that the place in question is much sought after by the owners of several motor-boats as the site for a club. Mr. Laws is an engineer who has spent most of his life in the Niagara river district and the fine drainage of St. Catharines is due to his zeal and ability. It is between forty and fifty years since he last visited Kingston as the guest of Grant Allan's father.

CAN TRY AGAIN. Dredging Contracts to Be Re-Let Very Soon. Ottawa, May 22.—Owing to the Ottawa Dredging Company having tendered for more government work than it can do, eighteen dredging contracts are open to those who tender before 10 a.m. for the dredging work. The Ottawa Dredging Company takes only four contracts. Hudson, on the Lake of Two Mountains; St. Andrew's, on the North River and Vancouver, all in the province of Quebec; Nigger and Telegraph Islands, Murray Canal, Ont., and St. John, N.B., harbor.
