TIP FROM EGYPT

FRENCH NAVAL PLANS PURLOINED AND SOLD

Two Dutchmen and an Englishman Under Arrest For Alleged Offense.

Paris, June 1.—The French police have made three arrests on a charge of espionage. Two of the men, named Barrier and Bartel, are Dutch, and the third, whose name is Blanchard, is said to be an Englishman. The latter was arrested in Paris last night. They are all now in prison. Two other arrests are said to be imminent.

Some time ago it was found that plans of many of the important French fortified naval bases had been stolen and sold to foreign powers. About two months ago the minister of marine received a curiously worded communication, with an Egyptian postmark, offering the restitution of stolen plans of Bizerte. A sum of 15,000 francs was demanded, otherwise the writer said the plans would be disposed of to a foreign power.

John Dunn was grounded into fragments by a C.P.R. train at Bordeaux, Ont., on Saturday morning. Seven persons are dead as the result of the trolley car collision in Elvira, Ohio, on Thursday.

The Canadian Northern railway is granted letters patent for the odd town lots in the town of Saskatchewan. Hon. Dr. Pyne admits that the successful tender of public school books varied from the specifications.

The Ontario Gazette announces a closed season for frogs in the county of Victoria, during May and June in each year. Three new mining companies appear among the new concerns announced in Ontario. They represent a capital of \$4,500,000.

The opening matches of the Canadian Military Rifle League open, Saturday, all over Canada. There are 115 conscripts and 50 cords of hard wood in the County of Frontenac. The lowest tender not necessarily accepted.

Where Are The Men? New York, June 1.—Two of three Armenians, wanted in connection with the murder of Father Knauer, have left the United States, according to Capt. McCafferty, of the detective bureau. The officer learned, yesterday, that a Russian man and Paul Salsian had been seen in a Canadian town two days after the murder is supposed to have been done.

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTHWEST HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS. Any even numbered section of Dominion lands in Manitoba or the Northwest Territories, exceeding 80 and not reserved, a 1/2 by be homesteaded by any person who is the head of a family or made over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter section, of 160 acres, more or less.
