FINAL PERFORMANCE IN MARINE CIRCLES

THE STEAMER KINGSTON BROKE HER WHEEL.

Was Delayed Here All Sunday—The New Steamer Rapids King—Vessel Movements in the Harbor. The initial trip of the steamer Kingston did not prove any too satisfactory in some respects and she was unable to reach Prescott. Instead the fine big liner lay at Swift's wharf all day Sunday. Coming past Moore's elevator toward the end of Swift's wharf, she ran upon it, striking away a portion of the dock with her bow. Under the backward prodding of the stern propellers, she swung in against the timbers. The result was a breaking of three buckets on the steamer's paddle wheel. It took all day and all night to repair the damage, but about seven o'clock this morning it was again under way. It is said there were about 200 passengers waiting at Charlotte to be taken over to Toronto.

COMMUNION DAY OBSERVED IN ST. MARY'S CATHEDRAL.

Seventy-Seven Young People Took Their First Communion—The Music a Feature—Sermon by Rev. A. J. Hanley. The important festival of Corpus Christi was observed in St. Mary's cathedral on Sunday, with all the solemnity and grandeur of the ritual of the Roman Catholic church. At an early hour a number of young boys and girls partook of their first communion. There was also a large number of adult communicants.

At 10.30 o'clock grand high mass was celebrated by Rev. Father McWilliams. In this mass the priest read in white and gold vestments. The altar was decorated with flowers and white and yellow. The procession of the altar was very impressive. The offertory of the "Ave Maria" was sung by Miss Ida Shaw. The choir sang the "Gloria" and the "Credo" with much spirit.

POST OFFICE LOBBY TO BE OPENED NO MORE ON SUNDAYS.

The boxholders didn't take advantage of it—Kingston is to have an Uptown Branch Post Office. Postmaster James Stewart has received notice from the department at Ottawa that the lobby of the local post-office is no longer to be kept open on Sunday. This order is not owing to a protest regarding Sunday opening, but because the boxholders did not take advantage of the lobby offered them. For instance, yesterday only nine boxholders secured letters from the office. On previous Sundays more than a dozen visited the post office to get their mail. When Inspector Ross was here two weeks ago, he inquired into the lobby question and when he found that so few boxholders took advantage of the lobby, he decided to recommend to the department that it be closed. So the lobby will no longer be open on the Sabbath, and no letters will be given out of the back door either.

Kingston is to have an uptown branch post office. For a long time the need of one has been felt by up-town residents, and Alderman John Carson has lately been pressing the matter upon the postmaster-general's department. To-day, Postmaster Stewart received notice from Ottawa that an uptown branch would shortly be established at the corner of Clergy and Princess streets. The new drug store of W. H.
