#### Synopsis of Canadian Northwest HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS

even numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba or the North-West Provinces, excepting 8 and 26, not reserved, may be homes eaded by any person the sole head of a family, or male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter section, of 160 acres, Application for homestead entry or inspec-tion must be made in person by the applicant at the office of the local Agent or Sub-Agent.

An application for entry or inspection made personally at any Sub-agent's office may be wired to the local agent by the Sub-agent, at the expense of the applicant, and if the land applied for is vacant on receipt of the telegram such application is to have priority and complete the transaction are received In case of "personation" the entry will be summarily cancelled and the applicant will forfeit all priority of claim.

An applicant for inspection must be eligible homestead entry, and only one application for inspection will be received from an indiuntil that application has been dis-A homesteader whose entry is in good standng and not liable to cancellation, may, sub-

ject to approval of Department, re'inquish it in favor of father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister, if eligible, but to no one else, on hang declaration of abandonment. Where an entry is summarily cancelled or voluntarily abandoned, subsequent to institution of cancellation proceedings, the applicant for inspection will be entitled to prior right

Applicants for inspection must state in what particulars the homesteader is in default, and if subsequently the statement is found to be incorrect in material particulars, the applicant will lose any prior right of re-entry been granted it may be summarily can-Duties-A sett'er is required to perform the

conditions under one of the following plans:

(1) At least six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year durno the term of three years. (2) If the father (or mother, if the father deceased) of a homestender resides upon a farm in the vicinity of the land entered for by such homesteader the requirement as to residence may be satisfied by such person residing with the father or mother.

(3) If the settler has his permanent residence upon farming land owned by him in the value of his homestead, the requirement may he satisfied by residence woon such land. Refore making application for patent the settler must give six months' notice in writing to the Commissioner of Dominion Lands at Ottawa, of his intention to do so.
