Synopsis of Canadian Northwest

HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS

Any even numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba or the North-West Provinces, excepting 8 and 26, not reserved, may be homesteaded by any person the sole head of a family, or male over 18 years of age, to

the extent of one-quarter section, of 160 acres.

An application for entry or inspection made personally at any Sub-agent's office may be wired to the local agent by the Sub-agent, at the expense of the applicant, and if the land

applied for is vacant on receipt of the tele-gram such application is to have priority and the land will be held until the necessary pa-

In case of "personation" the entry will be

An applicant for inspection must be eligible or homestead entry, and only one application or inspection will be received from an indi-idual until that application has been dis-

A homesteader whose entry is in good stand-

ing and not liable to cancellation, may, sub-

in favor of father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister, if eligible, but to no one

Where an entry is summarily cancelled or voluntarily abandoned, subsequent to institu-

tion of cancellation proceedings, the applicant for inspection will be entitled to prior right

Applicants for inspection must state in what particulars the homesteader is in default,

be incorrect in material particulars, the appli-

cant will lose any prior right of re-entry should the land become vacant, or if entry

SUNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST MINING

Coal.—Coal Lands may be purchased at \$10 per acre for soft coal and \$20 for anthracite.

Not more than 320 acres can be acquired by one individual or company. Royalty at the rate of ten cents per, ton of 2,000 pounds shall be collected on the gross output.

Ouartz.—A person eighteen years of age, or over, having discovered nuneral in place, may locate a claim, 1,500x1,500 feet.

The fee for recording a claim is \$5.

At least \$100 must be expended on the claim each year or paid to the mining recorder.


