LORD MAYOR OF LONDON DANCES IN COUNTRY VILLAGE.

London's Chief Magistrate Visits Scene of Childhood in Historic Cornwall—Made a Freeman of Helston—Old Times May Fete—Local Officials and Leading Men Participate in the Festivities.

From the popular point of view the feature of the lord mayor of London's Cornish tour was the visit to Helston when his lordship danced the "Furry dance."

Great as is the attraction of Helston "Flora Day," or "Furry Day," an ordinary day, the presence of Sir William Trevelyan added vastly to the interest displayed in this year's proceedings.

The first event with which the lord mayor was concerned was the conferring on him of the freedom of the borough, which ceremony was performed in the Guildhall, in the presence of a crowded assembly.

The hour now approached at which the far-famed "Furry dance" was to commence. It is one of the curious old-world ceremonies of which it is difficult to trace the origin.

Through dense crowds over forty couples made their way. H. M. Rogers and Miss Trevelyan led the way, and they were followed by the lord mayor and Mrs. Rogers, the "wags" not permitting the slightest difficulty to Sir William. Sheriff Dunn participated in the dance, as did the sheriff of Cornwall, the under-sheriff and many of the leading county people.

THE GREAT IRISH FAIR

LARGE CROWDS ARE NOW ATTENDING THE EXHIBITION.

Dublin Fair Proves Irish Possess Modern Spirit of Commercial Activity and Enterprise—Public Are Delighted—Buildings Are Splendid—Many Side Shows—Kerry Dance a Feature—Model Villages.

Like the Jamestown Exposition, the great Dublin Fair, the first of its kind in the history of Ireland, is not entirely completed, but already, since the recent opening, it promises to be even more of a success than its most sanguine promoters anticipated.

Every day since the opening great crowds have passed through the galleries, including hundreds of Americans, and everybody seems delighted with the unique show.

The exhibition is the answer of the people of Ireland to those of their detractors who deny them the modern spirit of commercial activity and enterprise. Four years ago an industrial conference was held in the Irish capital, at which men of all classes and creeds, and from the four provinces of the land, assembled to take counsel together as to the best manner in which the industrial welfare of their native land could be furthered.

The buildings are of great extent and exceptionally beautiful design. Their architectural features are in the main Florentine, but many deviations have been made to harmonize as far as possible with the natural features of the site.

It is, perhaps, the Irish village section that will be most interesting to visitors from overseas. There are shown Irish cottages, some of them models of what Irish cottages ought to be, a model of a village hall, a village school, and a typical western village street and a village green, where light-footed colleens will recall the zest of the "Kerry dance."

Came Shooters' Trophies. The many big game shooters among wealthy Britons who go to far distant and wild countries where the lion, the tiger and so on are to be found are always particularly anxious to preserve and to have set up for home display the skins of the animals that have fallen a prey to their prowess.

Unfortunately, the skins thus obtained have often to be treated in a very primitive style, in the first instance, from the taxidermist and furs dresser's point of view, says London Tit-Bits, and though the influence of tropical climates and imperfect preparation may arrive in England as stiff as boards.

Some of the most beautiful skins in the world are treated at a unique establishment in the east end of London, prior to being handed over to the regular fur dresser. At the place in question, the pelts of men, bare-footed and bare-legged to the knee, tread about, backward and forward, day after day, for a certain period upon each particular skin, and it is this application of the human foot that brings the skins back to a perfect state of pliability.

Fast Trains in England. To take only one or two from dozens of examples, the number of daily trains between London and Birmingham (113 miles) over the London and North-western, making over 56 miles an hour, is seven; between London and Exeter, over the Great Western (104 miles), the number running at a rate over 55 miles is four.
