OF GIRL IN LAST STAGES OF CONSUMPTION.

Means of Magnetism-Indepe dent Diagnoses By Eminer Men-The Vision the Girl Had Paris, June 15 .- Camille Flamma ion has just published the account an astounding cure by means of mag-netism of a young girl in the last stages of consumption, who had been given up by three separate physicians. Mile. B., twenty-eight years of age, was the orphan child of a mother who died of tuberculosis, while her brother succumbed to the same disease at eight years of age. Her own condition became worse and worse until April, 1905, when she took to her bed, apparently never to rise again.
