FITH OF THE NEWS.

The Very Latest Cullied From All Over The World.

Ex-Judge Henderson, Vancouver, has been appointed commissioner of the Yukon.

Earl Grey will push the button that will open the Toronto exhibition at 2 p.m. on August 27th.

At San Francisco, bail was denied Mayor Schmitz, and the court ordered that he be placed in jail.

It is reported that the Toronto plumbers would like to come to an agreement with the employers.

Seven men were overcome by gas at the Cobalt Central Mine. Prompt medical attention saved them.

At the South Huron liberal convention, held at Hensall, M. Y. McLean, a South Huron, secured the nomination.

An enormous group of solar spots have been observed by Prof. George H. Peters, of the United States naval observatory.

Plans have been prepared for imposing alterations to Rideau Hall, Ottawa, and it is expected that tenders will soon be called for.

The Ontario government has decided to prohibit the hunting, taking and killing of English or Mongolian pheasants for a period of three years from September 15th, 1907.

At the next election of councillors in the Yukon all are to be elected by popular vote. At present only five are elected and five appointed by the Dominion government.

Professor Edward Sawyer, of Wellesley, N.S., son of President Sawyer, of Acadia University, has accepted the presidency of Okanagan Baptist College, Sumnerland, B.C.

Henry has been made by the United States of the British government as to whether there is any objection to the stationing of another training ship on the great lakes.

At the trial of William D. Haywood, at Boise, Idaho, on Saturday, a dozen witnesses gave testimony tending to confirm several details of the story of Harry Orchard.

Two regiments of Chinese troops recently engaged the insurgents at Pate Zelan, with the result that the latter were compelled to retreat across the East river, and later were dispersed.

At Niagara Falls, N.Y., on Saturday, three freight cars broke from a train of fourteen cars in the middle of the lower steel arch bridge, and plunged into the rapids 250 feet below.

The senate of the University of New Brunswick has appointed L. W. Carson, London, Ont., to the chair of chemistry. He is a graduate of Toronto University, and holds the degree of Ph.D.

Montreal, Que., June 17.—The executive council of the International Boot and Shoe Workers' Union is in session here, to-day, and it is the first session of the body ever held in Canada. John F. Tobin, president of the union, presided. The annual convention of the union will be held in Toronto, August 12th, and the time of the executive, this morning, was taken up with arrangements for same. Five hundred delegates representing 75,000 workmen will attend the convention.

Horrible Torture of Negro.

Jacksonville, Fla., June 17.—Alfred Sargent, a negro, was hanged here for the murder of Jim Skyles. He faintly and had to be dragged to the gallows. After hanging five minutes it was found he was not dead and he was hauled up and given a second drop.

Chicago Theatre Burned.

Chicago, June 15.—Fire last night destroyed the Olympic theatre, causing a loss of 9100,000. There was no one in the playhouse. Guests of the Union restaurant and hotel, next door, were driven into the street.

Uphold Premier.

St. John's, Nfld., June 17.—The colonial cabinet, yesterday, voted to uphold Premier Bond in protesting against a sacrifice of Newfoundland's interests by the imperial government in the fisheries negotiations. The situation is regarded here as rather serious.

The Duke of Manchester has received an accession of \$15,000 a year, through the death of Harriet, Duchess of Manchester, the second wife and widow of his great-grandfather, the sixth duke. She was the daughter of Conway Dobbie, of Castle Dobbie, in county Antrim, and married fifty-seven years ago.

IS DISSOLVED

The Second Russian Douma is Over.

TOOK FINAL STEP

BEFORE THE DOUMA'S ANSWER WAS RECEIVED.

Orders Sent Out to Crush the Least Attempt at Disorders—The Ukase Issued and Posted on the Door of the Tauride Palace—A New Election in September.

St. Petersburg, June 17.—The second Douma has been dissolved. The council of ministers sat until after four o'clock, yesterday morning, at Elaguine Palace, Prime Minister Stolypin's residence, conferring as to whether to wait until Monday for the Douma's answer to the government's demand in regard to the socialist members, or to take the final step immediately. The minority, comprised of M. Stolypin, Kaufman, and Filossoff, opposed immediate dissolution. M. Stolypin telephoned to the czar, who answered that the majority were right, and, immediately, the decision was taken to dissolve the Douma. Orders were thereupon sent to the governors throughout Russia to take measures to crush the least attempt at disorders. At six o'clock, yesterday morning, infantry arrived at the Tauride Palace, where the Douma meets, and took possession of the desks and the Ukase of dissolution was posted on the doors. The Ukase is, in effect, a declaration of martial law, and now orders of the Douma, which a new election of members to another Douma be held beginning September 14th, and that the new imperial Douma will be convened on November 14th, of the present year.
