

Synopsis of Canadian Northwest HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS

Any even numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba or the North-West Provinces, containing 2 and 32, not reserved, may be homesteaded by any person the sole head of a family, or a male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter section of 160 acres, more or less.

GRIMSHAW TO GO TO TORONTO SOON.

Races For a Cup Offered By Emperor-Powers of the Eastern Baseball League Issues a Statement.

Galt won from Woodstock in the Western Ontario Baseball League on Saturday 6 to 5. In a Midland Baseball League contest Port Hope won at Oshawa by 12 to 3, winning their third game.

All Eastern League attendance records were broken when in Baltimore the home team and Montreal played a double-header, over eleven thousand paid admissions being registered.
