A BROKEN HEART

DESERTED BRIDE DIED AT ALEXANDRIA BAY.

Wife of "Ned" Francis, Who Mysteriously Disappeared, Finds Rest in Grave—Never Lost Faith in Missing Man. Alexandria Bay, N.Y., June 26.—Mrs. Etta Francis died at the home of her parents, Mr. and Mrs. William Hazelwood, of Hopewell Lodge, Browning's Island, Saturday night, from typhoid fever.

Two years ago Mr. Francis went away mysteriously, leaving his young wife, after nineteen months of happy wedded life, in a state bordering on frenzy. The missing man has been advertised for and rewards offered, but nothing has ever been heard of him. The young wife believed in her husband, and felt sure that some sort of violent death had overtaken him, else he would have written her.

Mr. Hazelwood, a stately gentleman of the old English stock, declared that Francis "won her heart to break it." Mr. and Mrs. Hazelwood formerly lived in Brockville, but moved to Browning's Island, on the death of W. Hazelwood, her father.
