

> "My evidence at the preliminary examination was voluntary. I needed ginia, this morning, and will be abonly to prove publication to establish my case, but I was desirous that the facts should be presented to the public. I made my statement not knowing what the evidence of the defence would be, something that was not at all necessary for me to do. "The mere fact of my presence in Toronto is being distorted into the belief that I am leaving to escape giving evidence. The case cannot come up until next January, and I am in no way responsible for the judge's decision. The charge, being a criminal one, is in the hands of the crown, and, like the other witnesses for the prosecution, I am in their hands."

Treated From Political Standpoint Rising from the couch on which he had been partially reclining, Mr. Emmerson continued: "This whole matter has been treated from a political standpoint, as if my own personal feelings, and those of my family were not to be considered in any way. The truth is that my personal honor and the good name of those dear to me has been the first consideration with mc. I feel that the evidence adduced at the preliminary examination removed the stigma contained in the defamatory statement from which the reader would infer that I had been ejected from an hotel with women of low character.
