In Vienna young women are constantly met with pulling good-sized wagons containing the implements of their calling. Occasionally they have the assistance of a dog as a companion in harness, but the dogs are apparently used more freely to assist the men who draw the milk carts. Occasionally the milkmen stop to exchange a friendly word with one another, when the dogs immediately, have a rest on their own account—illustrating the fact that man even here is the wiser animal. In Munich women sweep and clear the roads from the streets—and make a good job of it, too—while others open and close the switches of the electric car tracks with an iron rod, sitting sometimes for brief intervals on a chair by the curb. All this outdoor work tends to give the laboring women a weather-beaten, manly appearance, but I found myself regarding them with quite as much, if not more, respect than many of their idler sisters with "made up" complexions, pencilled eyebrows, and reddened lips.

Though I have now spent two months in countries, where little water is drunk, I have seen no drunkards. Where light wines and beer are the universal beverages, intoxication is rarely encountered. I recall the figure of a man I saw lying prone on the sidewalk in Rome, compelling passersby to step over him or into the road. Yet it did not occur to me that he was intoxicated. Rather that he was following the custom of the many idlers of the country, in taking advantage of the only piece of sunlight on the street to have a warm sun-bath, the weather being somewhat chilly. Where—as, for instance, in Vienna—half the population seem to be perpetually eating and drinking in the open air and in public places, the general sobriety is remarkable. The absence of bars and of ardent spirits, and the commingling of both sexes, the cafes, no doubt conduce to this. There may be evils possibly resulting from these customs, but drunkenness is assuredly not one of them.
