It is a Cherry Slight on a Bright Afternoon—Telling the People What to Do. When the big boat comes near, the bulk, to the seaming of the man on the docks, becomes monstrous. The passengers are crowded on the deck. Each class has its own quarters for even a common experience, a common peril, does not break down the rigidity of caste, which in Britain is deemed to be the foundation of social order.

OUTLOOK NOT BRIGHT.

Efficiency of Legal Intervention in Labor Disputes.

The arrest of a few strikers at Montreal the other day affords no pre- scription of the general efficiency of legal intervention in the industrial quarrel. It is upon the face of it impossible that free labor should be compelled by the police to continue their work, still more that they should be compelled to do the work well.

Another resolution noted with gratitude by the movement among druggists in the United States and Canada, is the direction of voluntarily retaining open or sickroom appliances, and the shortening of hours of opening.

After noting the fact that in Belgium and Switzerland there has been a reduction of more than 50 per cent in railway accidents, caused by the introduction of safety devices, since these countries stopped Sunday night-traffic, and the fact that the Parliament of Canada had recently largely restricted Sunday freight traffic on Canadian roads, the federation resolved to appeal to the United States Congress to enact a Sunday law similar to that recently passed in Canada.

CANADIAN INDIANS.

Red Men Come Miles to See a Circus Display.

Canadian Indians are in some respects more interesting than those in the United States, due partly to the fact that in sparsely settled parts of Canada they still retain their old dress and customs. They have always been peculiar on account of the Mounted Police, who in the early days taught the Indians to consider their men as friends.

The Canadian Indians are particularly fond of circuses and on circus day they may be seen on the street corners eagerly waiting for the procession. Usually the braves are dressed in a combination of street clothes and Indian finery. Over the Indian blanket, around the neck is worn a flaming-colored bandanna, and the ends of which are lengthened by twisting of vermine skins, which in this region sell for a few cents each.
