Synopsis of Canadian Northwest HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS Any even numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba or the North-West Provinces, excepting 8 and 26, not reserved, may be homesteaded by any person the sole head of a family, or male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter section, of 160 acres, more or less.

Application for homestead entry or inspection must be made in person by the applicant at the office of the local Agent or Sub-Agent.

An application for entry or inspection made ersonally at any Sub-agent's office may be vired to the local agent by the Sub-agent, at he expense of the applicant, and if the land pplied for is vacant on receipt of the teleram such application is to have priority and it land will be held until the necessary paers to complete the transaction are received ers to complete the transaction are received

In case of "personation" the entry will be immarily cancelled and the applicant will orfeit all priority of claim. omestead entry, and only one application appection will be received from an indi-until that application has been dis-

A homosteader whose entry is in good standing and not liable to cancellation, may, subject to approval of Department, relinquish it in favor of father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister, if eligible, but to no one else, on sung declaration of abandonment.

Where an entry is summarily cancelled or voluntarily abandoned, subsequent to institution of cancellation proceedings, the applicant for inspection will be entitled to prior right

that particulars the homesteader is in default, and if subsequently the statement is found to be incorrect in material particulars, the appli-cant will lose any prior right of re-entry should the land become vacant, or if entry has been granted it may be summarily can-Duties A settler is required to perform the

and cultivation of the land in each year during the term of three years.

(2) If the father (or mother, if the father is deceased) of a homesteader resides upon a farm in the vicinity of the land entered for by such homesteader the requirement as to residence may be satisfied by such person residing with the father or mother.

(3) If the settler has his permanent residence upon farming land owned by him in the value of his homestead, the requirement may be satisfied by residence upon such land. Before making application for patent the settler must give six months' notice in writing to the Commissioner of Dominion Lands at Ottawa, of his intention to do so.

Placer mining claims generally are 100 feet square, entry fee \$5, renewable yearly.

An applicant may obtain two leases to dredge for gold of five miles each for a term of twenty years, renewable at the discretion of the Minister of the Interior.

The lessee shall have a dredge in operation within one season from the date of the lease for each five miles. Rental, \$10 per annum for each mile of river leased. Royalty at the rate of \$1.8 per cent. collected on the output after it exceeds \$10,000.


