THE DREAM OF PEACE.

There are some people who expect results from the Hague peace conference. The great tribunal had its origin in the desire to end the disputes that lead to war without the arbitrament of the sword, and though so far there has been little but talk the conviction is that all the while the influences are at work which make for peace. Granted that the last conference was hardly over when the warlike feeling was as rife as ever, and that some of the nations or powers that negotiated for a good understanding showed no marked change in their proceedings, the fact that the governments are represented from time to time in meetings at which the incidents of war are disapproved will have its effect.

OLD WAY THE BEST.

FEWER WOMEN RIDE ASTRIDE IN LONDON.

St. Petersburg, July 10.—The following anecdote about the emperor is at present being heartily appreciated by most classes of society. The story goes that one day the czar and the empress had a conversation which ran as follows: The Empress—My dear Nicholas, you must not always agree with everybody. Now, this morning, Mr. Stolypin made a report, and after he was through you said, "Mr. Stolypin, you are quite right." I quite agree with you. Five minutes later Durnovo came. What he told you was absolutely opposed to that which Stolypin had said, but again you remarked, "My dear Durnovo, you are quite right. I quite agree with you." Finally Mr. Schwabenbach came and told you something different from what the other two gentlemen had told you, and again you said, "Mr. Schwabenbach, you are quite right. I quite agree with you."

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The local government has not ignored the grievances of the people of New Ontario. The minister of mines, attended by a strong body guard, not that he was afraid to face the discontents alone—has been up through the agitated district and has learned a great deal. He has, by talks with individuals, and by deputations, learned what the people are protesting against, and Hon. Mr. Cochrane considers that on some questions there is reason for action.

ELECTED PRESIDENT.

Of The Theosophical Society of The World. London, July 10.—Mrs. Annie Besant has been elected president of the Theosophical Society, in succession to the late Col. Henry Steel Olcott, who died in India last February. She will visit America, and other countries before returning to the headquarters of the society in India.

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The People Pay. The plumbers' strike in Toronto has cost the union \$80,000, which the poor old public will have to make good in the usual way.

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Mayor Jukes of London says he will not run again. This, no doubt, is what gives rise to the story that he will be made lord high executioner, with headquarters in Queen's Park, Toronto.

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The usual reports are in circulation to the effect that a general election will be held this fall. These have been denied by prominent politicians, but from now forward the work of organization will probably be prosecuted with vigor by both parties.

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Officials throughout Ontario feel that their chiefs in Toronto are disloyal to them and ready to take sides with any hostile Tory whom in the course of their duty they may offend. This was the genesis of the Orangeville case. Mr. Whitney is a believer in British constitutionalism. Well, one of its axioms is that the ministers of the crown in their various capacities should stand by those who leave to administer justice.

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SOME PAYING WORKS.

Experiments in municipal ownership in Great Britain are being closely watched and successes and failures noted. In Coves, Eng., municipal gas works have netted \$25,000 in five years which has been applied to reduction of the city's indebtedness. In West Bromwich the municipal trolley lines have lost heavily, and a committee of investigation has lately reported that the failure was due to errors in the original calculations. The Ratepayers' Association has called upon certain officials to resign. Portsmouth has had a very encouraging year. The net profit of all municipal undertakings—trams, electric lights, telephones and docks—comes to \$150,000, of which \$55,000 will be devoted to the relief of the rates. Success depends, after all, in municipal as in private trading upon the capacity of the individuals in charge, and the whole question turns upon the capacity of the ratepayers to put capable men in office and keep them there. A good many English municipalities have learned how to do this.
